




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


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Rocky Mountain Raclette BRINGS A TASTE OF SWITZERLAND TO SINGLETREE


lida Zwaan Gregory has participated in Inside Singletree Leach month by offering neighborhood residents a glimpse into the homes of friends and neighbors throughout the community that exemplify the Singletree lifestyle. In recognition of her contribution, the 2016 Year in Review offers an opportunity to get to know the resident Sponsor behind "Home of the Month."

Alida Zwaan Gregory first came to Vail in the mid 60's with her family. Alida's father, known as the "Bear," had spent most of his youth in Holland and traveled through Europe bicycling during the summer and skiing during the winter. Mr. Zwaan served in the U.S. Army as an interpreter during World War II; after the War, the "Bear" married Alida's mother and the new couple moved to Lawton, Oklahoma, where Mrs. Zwaan's family had business interests. Mr. Zwaan wanted his children to experience the mountains and skiing as he did as a youth, so the family traveled during winter vacations to Taos, Sun Valley, Aspen, Breckenridge and Vail. Alida's younger sister, Wendy, said, "Daddy, I like Vail the best." The rest is history. The Zwaans bought a townhome in 1969. Alida left Vail to travel and work in Germany for two years after which she returned to Vail. She moved briefly to Austin, Texas, but the mountains continued to beckon her home. Alida returned to Vail permanently in 1978 and this has been her home ever since.

Alida got her real estate license and initially worked with Holland and Associates. Not long after, she joined John Slevin's firm, Gore Range Properties, and has continued to work with Joh and now his son, Michael, in the different iterations of the firm, currently Berkshire Hathaway Home Services. During her tenure as a Realtor with the Slevin's family firm, she has received n merous awards as a Top Producer and has helpe hundreds of individuals find their special home the mountains.

Alida met her husband, George, at a business mee ing in 1994, and they quickly discovered they had many mutual interests. Just like the "Bear" buyin a townhome in Vail, the rest is history. George is from central Kentucky where he practiced law in Lexington and managed a horse farm in Woodford County, the heart of the Bluegrass and the center of the thoroughbred industry. George bought his first property in Vail in 1976 and finally decided t mountains were more alluring than law and hors He moved to Vail permanently in late 1994 when and Alida were married.

George had expected to retire in '94 but became bored quickly and began construction and general contracting work building a number of great homes in Vail, Beaver Creek and Singletree. Both Alida and George have been involved in the growth and development of Singletree since 1994 by serving on various committees of the Singletree Property Owners Association (SPOA) and the Berry Creek Metro-

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
