### **meet** your neighbors

riting one's autobiography is a daunting and formidable task as it has been asked of me to do so for this publication, which includes the biography of my wife, Faith April Bleesz, who is a major element in this story.

A story is if I can take James Thurber as my guiding force and mention his celebrated book, "My Life and Hard Times" as a starting point. Thurber, America's foremost humorist and cartoonist, (1894-1961), a dog lover of the highest order, is a factor in my life who impacted me greatly as an artist. But first some preliminaries.

I was born in 1944, first son of Juliette & Antone Bleesz, who were French Alsacian immigrants, immigrants who came with their respective au pairs in their early teen years (1920s) seeking opportunities in the New World. They met in NYC at the French Alsacian Club during the war years. My brother, Paul, was born in 1946, and by that time, the family had moved to a rural Massachusetts country estate in the Berkshire Mountains along the Appalachian Trail.

My father, called Tony, did not have an education, and my mother had obtained a high school degree. Education was a valued goal of my parents for my brother and me; hence we became students at a prep school in rural Connecticut as my father, with his wife as his assistant, accepted a position as the French Chef at the school. My enrollment with fellow students from Greenwich, Rye, Scarsdale, Darien and such was tumultuous, value challenging and impacting.

Due to the French teacher at this school, an introduction to James Thurber was made. Tony and Juliette decided to accept positions with James



Thurber and his wife at their West Cornwall, Connecticut estate: Tony, the Chef & chauffeur and Juliette, Mrs. Thurber's secretary. Our family lived an idyllic life in rural Connecticut, with Thurber dogs, and a small ski area within view of our kitchen window, across from a cow pasture. One of my earliest jobs was that of a rope tow "lifty," besides milking cows and stacking hay.

In 1955 and in 1958, my parents took my brother and me to visit respective cousins, uncles, grandparents in France, the grandparents who were on their deathbeds. Sailing across the Atlantic to Cherbourg on the Queen Elizabeth, the Queen, the USS ship, United States (1958). The family was specifically visiting the petite village of Reichfeld along the route du vin in Alsace, the birthplace of my father and where the Bleesz name goes back to the 1600s in church records.

The 1958 trip was monumental as my father included his elderly au pair & husband as well. Tony shipped across the Atlantic a large Chevrolet station wagon for six people & luggage. A life-altering trip, a hoot, my beginnings as a Francophile, childhood interest in history and geography, and my foundation in photography as my parents purchased a Leica 111f (1958) which I still have & use on occasion.

I had been exposed to the West, specifically Colorado, very early in my life, and I wanted to be a Marlboro Cowboy. Due to Thurber's books, access to his library, his drawings, the NYC literary personalities who came to Thurber's dinner table, and some other influential educational mentors I had, I decided to pursue history & photography in college, and I chose Utah State University for its cultural diversity, its uniqueness, its skiing and its affordability.

Degree in history & my post graduate thesis program interrupted due to the Tet Offensive, Chicago demonstrations (1968), I spent time in the US Army. As an "elder" at that particular time, I had a hard time mentally dealing with thrusting fixed bayonets into protesting civilians in front of the Lincoln Memorial in DC, protestors who were protesting the Nam war.

Resuming civilian life in 1970 took me to Idaho Springs, my first teaching position where I taught upper-level social studies, intro-

duced a photographic program, taught Outdoor Ed, initiated intramural soccer program, and assumed a ski instructor, area photographer's position at Loveland for 20 years while living in Georgetown, the Silver Queen of the West. Eventually, I became the official US Handicap Ski Team Photographer for the 1982 World Championships for the Disabled in Leysin, Swiss.


While in "Gtown," I purchased a historic 1887 down-town commercial building which I restored, opened a retail store as well as my photo gallery/studio and served as a "Selectman" for the town. I became known as the "town documentary photographer" as I had dealings with the State Historical Society.

In 1989/90, I moved to the Vail Valley & worked at the Ralph Lauren retail store in Vail. I accepted a position as the buyer/manager at the Shop at Cordillera for eight years. Faith and I started our romance & thoughts of the future as we had met in a French class at CMC. We married in September 1995, and a honeymoon in France occurred.

Faith ironically came from Connecticut as well. She attended & degreed at the University of Miami and went West to Denver for her first real job, that being an accountant doing work for a CPA. Moving to Vail in 1982, she worked part time as a waitress at the Red Lion and commenced a position at the Vail Racquet Club as the Controller for 18 years. In 1997, we built our home in Singletree. In 1999, we opened our retail store, Brush Creek Dry Goods, in the Riverwalk Complex in Edwards.

Brush Creek Dry Goods has been in business for 18 years. Our women's & men's clothing fit a nitch here in the Vail Valley. Our advertising is best by word of mouth. Our clothing can be described as Friday nightwear, casual business, travel & mountain luxury attire. We have a loyal following of locals, second homeowners & tourists. We are proud of the service we provide to our clientele and have two outstanding staff members. Our vendors are those which can be found at the better women's/men's stores in Denver and Boulder. We offer uniqueness & quality.

My photography (film, digital) as a fine art has accompanied me since 1976. We enjoy reading, traveling & hosting small dinner conversational parties with friends as Faith is accomplished in the kitchen while I assist her. Daily exercise is Faith's routine while I tend to the yard, large garden, numerous







apple trees, my darkroom, and write short stories. Croquet during the summer & skiing in the winter are other activities.

Faith enjoys animals, our Hemmingway cat, Sammie, and may look into that arena upon retirement while I will continue my fine art photography. I am a co-founder of the Vail Valley Art Guild Photographer's group, and I display in Denver area galleries. Faith and I intend to remain in Singletree into the future. A quote from James Thurber perhaps may be appropriate: The past is an old armchair in the attic, the present an ominous ticking sound, and the future is anybody's guess. C'est la vie.


Tara is very successful with her figure skating students in basic skills, freestyle, moves in the field,



# BRIGHT FUTURE FOUNDATION

Offers Opportunities To Make A Difference

Lissa Tyler and Sheri Mintz are evidence of what great teamwork can do for an organization. Both deeply committed to the Bright Future Foundation ("BFF") and its role in the Vail Valley, they were eager to share the history of the organization, its programs and its needs.

As Executive Director for the past eight years, Sheri is well versed in the grassroots history of the organization. In 1983, a group of women met in the basement of the Vail Chapel in response to an ad in the newspaper alerting the community to an emerging social issue, that of domestic violence. At that meeting, the issue was discussed, the hat was passed to fund the first mailing and the Women's Resource Center was born.

Fast forward nearly 34 years and the mission of Bright Future Foundation remains true to the early vision of the Women's Resource Center, but with greater strength and resources to fuel its efforts. Today, Bright Future Foundation offers a range of services, from prevention to crisis intervention to recovery, for victims of domestic violence or sexual assault. In addition to a 24/7 hotline, Bright Future Foundation provides a safe house at an undisclosed location that can house up to five families who are

fleeing from domestic violence. The facility is intended for shortterm residency, up to a couple of months, but beyond that, BFF can assist in finding long-term housing solutions to help families ulti-



mately become self-sufficient through its Rapid ReHousing program.

With respect to prevention, BFF offers a youth violence prevention program, called Empowerment, to work with middle school boys to dispel negative gender stereotypes. Additionally, the Buddy Mentor program has been operating almost as long as BFF. Similar in model to Big Brother/ Big Sister across the country, the program offers highly supported volunteer mentors a unique opportunity to inspire and foster at risk youth through building consistent and trusting relationships. BFF requests a one-year commitment and in exchange, works carefully to create the right match to deliver a genuinely heartwarming, gratifying experience for all.

> BFF is staffed by 10 full-time employees, including a fully licensed clinical psychologist with a specialty in trauma-focused care, a psychologist intern and a full-time attorney. Additionally, the staff includes a number of advocates who work with victims, offering moral support and connecting them with community resources so that eventually they become survivors. The greatest human resource within the organization is, of course, its volunteers who posted 19,000 hours of volun-

teer time last year. Serving the entire Vail Valley, BFF responds to an average of 355 hotline calls per year and last year, served 670 victims of domestic violence and sexual assault.



Lissa Tyler has been involved with BFF for about six years and has recently stepped into the role of Chairperson of the Board. Having spent more than 20 years with the Vail Valley Foundation, Lissa had been actively involved in social advocacy for her entire career. Not only did her past experience make her keenly aware of issues relative to education and schools, but more importantly, she explains, "my heart has always been in that direction."

Lissa explains that the Board is committed to being smart with their budget and emphasizes that every dollar goes to work. She describes the BFF fundraising events as fun and at the same time, casual and low key. The Aces and Eagles Golf Tournament, including a women's tennis event, marked its 17th year in September and continues to be a tremendous fundraiser for the organization. Arrowhead has graciously hosted the event the past five years and Lissa enthusiastically invites fellow Singletree residents to participate in Aces and Eagles next September!

Additionally, BFF has been the primary charity for the Beaver Creek Resort Company's Wine Spectator event for quite some time. Featuring an exquisite dinner and live auction with outstanding wines at Splendido, this annual event in August of each year is recognized as a lovely evening of fine cuisine and camaraderie for a worthy cause. Another fantastic event to put on your calendar! These events, as well as government funding and private donations, are the primary resources for operating the organization and all of its programs. Demonstrating tremendous impact in a rural area through its 24/7 hotline, safe house shelter, Rapid ReHousing program, on-staff psychologists and Buddy Mentor program, Lissa is proud to say that BFF has become an impressive model across the state.

If you are interested in getting involved with BFF, Sheri and Lissa encourage you to do so! Manning the hotline and becoming a Buddy Mentor are both great opportunities to combat domestic violence and sexual assault and to give back to your community. 


