





The Power of Pink:

How One Singletree Resident Fought Cancer With Color

Lisa Stoffel just has an energy. She is a positive, optimistic, and

ebullient person who is dedicated to conquering every obstacle that is placed in her path. As a survivor of breast cancer and an avid supporter of the Spirit of Survival program offered at Shaw Regional Cancer Center, she is excited for Pink Vail™, the world's biggest ski day to conquer cancer, on March 25, 2017. Lisa was kind enough to sit down with me and share why Pink Vail is so important, and how the Spirit of Survival program funded by Pink Vail change lives affected by every "color" of cancer.

Tom and Lisa Stoffel are full-time Singletree residents and practically newlyweds who moved here because they love the deep sense of active community. "It was an aspiration. There's a strong sense of community that I love here. I'm from Manhattan, you know," jokes Lisa. "There's a very positive, energetic vibe with healthy, active, interesting and smart people." Like many valley residents, the Stoffels spend their time golfing together in the summers and participating in snow sports in the winters. "Well," smiles Lisa, "I ski, but Tom snowboards." No rivalry there! This infectiously positive vibe definitely translates into all aspects of Lisa's life and the lives of her family and friends. "I love Pink Vail because the Valley comes together in positivity to celebrate the fight against cancer. I participated in it since its inauguration even before I was diagnosed."

Lisa was diagnosed and treated for early stage breast cancer in 2014 at Shaw. In the spring of 2016, when her father-

> in-law (lovingly known as Big T) was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer, Lisa and Tom knew that having Shaw down the street would enable them to help him fight his cancer and aid in his recovery. "We moved my father-in-law from San Francisco since it was either arrange for care there or have him move in with us," recalls Lisa. "I think Big T is a chemo rock star. The main reason he's doing well is that he's

here with us. We take care of him, and his therapy is just a mile down the street. He feels the support of the community there and we appreciate the personalization of caregiving." It's this sense of personalization and true care that patients and their families echo as one of the most important aspects of being treated at Shaw.

Since 2012, Pink Vail has raised over \$2.4 million to benefit all patients at Shaw through enhancements to patient care and underwriting the Spirit of Survival program. This unique program provides all patients the opportunity to receive free exercise training, nutrition coaching, emotional support, massages, acupuncture, outdoor adventures and much more. Lisa quotes, "I am fortunate to have Shaw in my backyard. In addition to the high-medical-caliber of the oncology team, their integrative, holistic approach to caring for me as a person and my spouse

Lisa participated in the Slim for Survival pilot group in 2015, the brainchild of Dr. Patricia Hardenbergh. "SLIM is an exercise and nutrition lifestyle program for cancer patients out of treatment, with the intention of helping them lose weight and increase their fitness level. There is scientific data and studies showing that doing both can reduce your risk of cancer recurrence," says Lisa. She says it works better than any other diet and exercise program because of the team of nutritionists and the behavioral modification techniques. The Slim for Survival care team includes Nutritionist Melaine Hendershott, Exercise physiologist Sarah Giovagnoli and Program Coordinator and Behavior Change Specialist Renea Nilsson. All in all a great team to have on your side.

through the Spirit of Survival programs has been invaluable." So what does Spirit of Survival do, exactly?

Let's say you've just moved to Singletree, and you go in for your yearly mammogram appointment. Something is found that isn't quite right, and you hear that terrible word, CANCER. Insurance covers the basic costs of radiation and/or chemotherapy and doctors' visits, and some post-recovery checkups if you are so lucky. But living as a survivor has its daily challenges emotionally, physically, and spiritually that need to be supported as patients work themselves back into their lives. Each patient follows a program that is tailored to his or her specific needs, even those needs never previously addressed before cancer. In Lisa's case, a new passion in art was discovered. "I have never really


What is the most challenging aspect of ski racing for you? Having the confidence to finish strong and fast in the qualifiers so I can make the National Championships. Balancing a high grade point average in my senior year has also taken a lot of time. I want excellent grades to get into a good college and to ski race for them and that's really hard to do with so much talent here.

Who do you idolize in the sport? The Norwegian Ski Team.

What kind of time commitment does your skiing require? A typical day for me is:

a.m.: Train in Vail.

p.m.: Drive to Academy in Minturn, eat lunch, go to school until 5 p.m. then go to MFC (Minturn Fitness Center) and work out.



What competitive ski racing events have you participated in? I

have competed all across North America, from prestigious events in Canada, NorAm's in Colorado, and regular FIS races across the nation. Just recently, I had a qualifier at Eldora a few weeks ago. I just got home from Aspen and I'm leaving in two days to go to MN for my last qualifier. I'm hoping to make the National Championships out East this year. That would be awesome.

What are your best results? Second in GS at Eldora; third in Downhill at Aspen; third in Super G at Aspen

What have you learned from ski racing? That it takes a lot of energy and commitment from me, my parents, and people who have been nice enough to help me find my journey. It's a really expensive sport and there's a lot of equipment involved too. My parents do what they can financially but it's expensive to ski race. We've gotten a few sponsors this past year and I'm so grateful that they've helped me out. But I love it and I'm being surrounded by a lot of support. My coaches are a BIG part of my success as

well! They spend more time with me than my parents do during the rigorous race season!

What is your favorite moment in skiing? I've had a quite a few, probably finishing a good race knowing that I left it all on the course. This past season has been filled with successful races and this shall be a season to remember. I also have amazing memories from my ski trips to Europe.

What are your racing ambitions? To take a year off between graduating from high school this year and ski race. I'm still dreaming of doing something really special before I'm done skiing. I'm not sure what it will be but I'm going to try my hardest to see what my best might do for me in my future.

What other activities or sports do you participate in? I really love mountain bike racing!

How do you balance skiing with school and other activities? It's

very hard to balance schoolwork with the amount of training and traveling that I do for skiing and biking. It was better to move here from Denver so I could go to the Academy, which allows all snow

sports athletes to train in the morning and then go to school in the afternoon, train at MFC next to the academy and then make it home in time to eat, get school work done, tune my skis for the next day before I get up and do it all over again. But I love it!

Can you offer a piece of advice for someone looking to get into ski racing? It takes a LOT of patience, hard work, and perseverance to be competitive as a ski racer but as long as you are enjoying the sport and you're working hard, reach for your goals and don't quit.

Is there anything else you would like to share with your friends and neighbors about your skiing experience?

I've absolutely loved being able to travel the world skiing at a young age. Although it's a pretty hard sport, I know that I've become a stronger person because of my commitment to my sports and academics. It takes a strong family to get me to where I have gotten to. My dad still lives in Denver and my mother lives up here with me. I know it's hard on my dad to see us only when he gets up here once a week, but I'm grateful that they've supported me for the last four-plus years of living up here.



photography, I love telling a story in pictures, and no story is more important than someone's family story or wedding day.



At night I sleep in my own bed or with my parents. I am an expert at excavating, which is a skill that translates nicely into always finding a way to situate myself under a blanket.


