



## LIGHTS, EFFICIENCY & THE NIGHT SKY



For energy and fiscal efficiency, the Berry Creek Metro District recently switched all of the lights at intersections in Singletree to

high efficiency LED fixtures. The Singletree Community Center also uses all LED lights for energy efficiency, including our holiday light strands. LEDs are extremely efficient and consume at least 75% less power and last 25 times longer than incandescent bulbs.

When you are replacing your home's exterior lights consider dark sky compliant (a designation given to fixtures for reducing waste of ambient light) fixtures that allow all of us to enjoy our starry nights right here in Singletree.

Did you know that all exterior lighting should direct light downward and the light source should not be visible from your neighbor's property? For more info check out Singletree's Design Guidelines at

## this Summer?

Need to chill-out? If you plan to install an air-conditioning condenser unit, all of the equipment installed on the exterior of your home shall be located within the setbacks and as close to the home as possible. The unit(s) shall be screened from view with evergreen landscaping too. In Singletree, air-conditioning condensers are also required to have a 10 or higher SEER (Seasonal Energy Efficiency Ratio).





Orchestrated by Mark Sassi, our resident fly fishing enthusiast, the group was treated to gear and instruction by John Packer,


Bobby Stedman and Kip Wolcott, from Fly Fishing Outfitters in Avon.



Parents often wonder if songs they hear coming from kids in showers can grow into songs performed in a room (no water), on a stage, in a theater.

Parents might wonder, but Singletree 10-year-old resident Hayden DiVenere wanted to find out. Sure, Hayden plays lacrosse with Vail Lax, snowboards, likes to fly fish, golfs and does all the typical boy stuff ... but singing? He sounded good in the back seat of the family car singing to current songs but that is a long way from performing in front of people, no voice over, under the bright lights without losing pitch. And maybe, moving appropriately to the beat. It is not easy. People are watching.

So Annah Scully (another Singletree resident) and her 22-year Vail Performing Arts Academy (VPAA) seemed to be the organization where all kids (ages 8-18) can learn a bit more about themselves, find out if they like performing, have some *interest* in these talents and want to work with others for a common goal. Three times a year VPAA brings together children of varying and unexplored talents, to create a production that surprises parents and friends by the discipline of the children, professionalism of their accomplishment and amazement of the patience of artistic director Colin Meiring.

So Hayden, then 8 years old, decided to audition for a SOLO and group roles (other songs and dances) in a VPAA production to be held at the Vilar Center. This would be a long way from the back seat. Under the incredible guidance of Annah and Colin, and their


generous staff, Hayden learned to dance, act and sing with the company and twice performed a SOLO, in the 500-plus seat Vilar Center. No water. No net.

This led to solo songs at 9 years old and again at 10 in 500 seat theaters, joining with other 'arts' motivated kids to time their dances, hit their marks, and harmonize with boys and girls. The productions are incredible: Colin herds cats better than anyone.


This also led Hayden to Colin's Hip Hop Dance Class, in Edwards. These classes *challenge* young boys to *attempt* to synchronize their arms, legs and torsos in graceful athletic movements, and not appear as if they are suffering injuries looking for a place to land. Tough stuff for bodies undergoing explosive growth.

With this background and confidence, and believing he had musical talent, Hayden and *many* valley children auditioned for SOLO and duet spots for a song to be performed at the Vail Valley Foundation – Star Dancing Gala, Eagle Jet Center July 18, 2017. Hayden was one of 10 finalists and ultimately awarded a solo part and duet singing role. This time in front of 800-1,000 people. Again, no water, no net. Talented singer — 10 years old in front of a lot of people. How? VPAA showed him.

Though Hayden is only 10, there are lessons for all in his journey. Children and adults must search where talents lie and nurture them. For the more than 400-plus children participating in VPAA programs a year, there is fun and growth that extends to many aspects of life. Acting, singing, and dancing on stage demands









discipline and builds confidence for public speaking, job interviews, group projects, and even looking a person in the eyes when you shake hands (you must do so while receiving kudos after the performance). Talent is not the key; attitude and curiosity are.

Yes, some children have talents but all have an interest in finding out what might be possible. Growth comes from a willingness to get to new and perhaps uncomfortable places under watchful caring eyes. For Hayden, it is athletics, singing and dance. In the neighborhood. Great stuff.

Hayden explored the unknown at 8. He still sings in the car and shower, but now he also sounds great on stage in front of many. It started with the strength to take a chance and a young boy singing for fun. Hopefully ... this is more to come.





**Did you design or decorate your home yourself?** We decorated our home based on our travels throughout Colorado.




## On Two Pedals A Day

It was late December of last year when my wife, Lisa, began the search for a trip we could take in May. One of her sources was a catalog we had recently received from Vermont Bike Tours (VBT) that described the almost 50 possible bike tours available on any of six continents. Apparently bicycling in Antarctica presented some unique challenges that no one was particularly excited about.


We had heard about VBT primarily from my sister and brother in law who had enjoyed them so much that they had been on ten of their trips over the years. Based on their strong endorsement and despite the fact that neither of us had spent any time on a bicycle other than the stationary bike at the gym, Lisa decided that we should give it a shot. Well, why not? The trip we decided on was to Croatia and the Dalmatian Islands.

I'm 69, Lisa is 53. Neither of us owned, much less rode, a bike. We would be joining a group of up to 20 people we had never met for ten days that included six straight days of biking up to 40 miles and five hours a day for a trip that, according to the VBT catalog, "... includes more hills. Longer distance options can be very rewarding for those who cycle regularly." Add to the mix the fact that I was scheduled for hip replacement surgery a mere three months before the trip was to begin. What could possibly go wrong? The answer to that question is simple ... nothing whatsoever!

It was an extraordinary adventure for both of us.














The geography is dramatic to a fault. The islands we visited, Brac and Hvar, are only two of over 1000 islands off the coast of Croatia. They are both achingly scenic. Mountainous, green, latticed with olive groves, vineyards, dramatic fields of poppies and lavender, all emerging from the almost unbelievably cobalt blue, glass-clear waters of the Adriatic Sea.

We biked from sea level up to dramatic heights that offered breathtaking views virtually every day. That was a bit of a challenge at times, but we pedaled on knowing that for every uphill struggle there is a waiting view that will be amazing and a long, relaxing downhill glide.

Bicycling, however, was not the only activity that VBT arranged for us. Our group was treated to a full day's excursion by private van to the wine country outside Dubrovnik. We visited three wineries; the same family had operated one of them for over 500 years! Our two local, bi-lingual guides, Natasa and Nevin, arranged dinners for us at both traditional Croatian restaurants and private homes to give us the opportunity to experience Croatian culinary and social life on a level the casual tourist never could.



We were also given a private tour of one of only two remaining stonemason schools in the world, located in Pucisca on the island of Brac. At the school, high school aged students are taught the art of cutting the pure white limestone for which the island is famous for works of art that range from religious to secular, the incredibly delicate to monumental. The limestone found in the quarries of Brac is so perfect that it supplied the stone for the last exterior renovation of the White House.

The overall impression Lisa and I were left with was that our bike trip through the Dalmatian Islands was one of the most interesting, fascinating, and, at times, exhausting experiences either of us has had. The organization and professionalism of Vermont Bike Tours and our two guides, Natasa and Neven, was unbelievable and the people and countryside of Croatia left an impression on us that will not fade.

If you have ever had the desire to get out of the car and really experience a country on a basic, human level I cannot recommend a bike trip strongly enough. If you are looking for a tour operator who will exceed your expectations and show you the country like a local, you cannot do better than VBT in my view, and if you're looking for an adventure that combines everything from the historic and artistic to the rhythms of everyday life, I highly recommend the Dalmatian Coast of Croatia.

What advice do you have for adults? I think that we should have no, no, no bad guys. Everyone should be nice.


What's your favorite movie of all time? Frozen!


