Neighborhood Camaraderie Abounds at MAIN ST. GRILL

Main St. Grill has been a longstanding favorite among Singletree residents for years. The casual atmosphere, friendly service and outstanding food have brought owners Chris and Nikki Heiden a loyal following right here in Edwards. That being said, there are also those who have possibly overlooked the go-to familiarity and reliability of the restaurant and may not have visited in some time. Either way, the residents of Singletree gathered on a quiet November evening to taste a wide selection of menu offerings and enjoy an evening of neighborhood camaraderie.

Service is refreshingly prompt and professional at Main St. Grill. The experienced team of servers were quick with drink orders and followed shortly thereafter with appetizers. This evening, the round of starters featured Coconut Shrimp served with a Thai chili dipping sauce and a Chicken Quesadilla with pepper jack and cheddar cheeses, caramelized onions, sour cream, salsa and Pico de Gallo. The simple word "Yum" (a direct quote from Felicia), and even "Yum Yum", appeared frequently on many tasting sheets for both the shrimp and the quesadilla.

Many remarked on the crispiness of the Coconut Shrimp, including Sherrie Schaeffer who also loved the great sauce pairing. Kris Woodruff remarked that the coconut flavor on the shrimp was delicious, a sentiment echoed by several others as well. Mio Cirkovic rated the shrimp a 5+/10 and then noted, "I changed my mind. 6+/10"! Bev Trout deemed the Coconut Shrimp to be "excellent" with "good presentation" and the Chicken Quesadilla to be "very flavorful". Linda Wilson is a fan of quesadillas and found the Main St. version to be very good. Nate Free enjoyed the great combo of ingredients in the quesadilla and his wife, Lisa Siegert-Free, endorsed the appetizer by with her remark, "I would order it again." Need we say more?

Main St. Grill truly outdid themselves with their House Specialty Entrees served family style, allowing every guest the opportunity to taste each dish and demonstrating their outstanding ability to deliver something for everybody. First served was the Grilled Flatiron Steak topped with a choice of blue cheese butter and brown sauce reduction or a Steak Diane (mushroom brandy











cream) sauce. Bryan Coffey enjoyed the excellent taste and tender texture of the steak and Lai White and Marv Olson both voted the steak as their favorite dish of the evening.

The T. Louis Pork Ribs, hand rubbed and slow cooked with BBQ sauce, are a signature dish at Main St. Grill. Buzz Finn showed his enthusiasm with 4 hand-drawn stars. Laurel Hendrickson described the melt-in-your-mouth ribs as "soooo tender – the best!" Melanna Marcelot, obviously a returning guest, remarked that the ribs were "excellent as always". Liz James commented that the fries served with the ribs are excellent; and Carol Calinoff gave those same fries a 5+.

The Chicken Piccata dish is comprised of sautéed chicken breast tomatoes, and a lemon butter caper sauce over angel hair pasta. Karen Wilhelm was pleasantly surprised to find the Piccata to be excellent and went on to say, "I rarely order chicken but this was very good!" Randy Redding loved the sauce that topped the chicken and pasta. And Eric Johnson pointed out that the dish was "tender and buttery; [the] pasta was the best part".

From the sea, the Ahi Tuna entrée is sesame panko crusted, seared rare, and served with Thai sesame vinaigrette, snap peas and rice

pilaf. David Irwin awarded the entrée a 5+ and expressed that it was "amazing in every way." Robert Wilhelm noted it was very good with "perfect preparation". The Ahi Tuna proved to be the favorite for Liz James as well and Noel Harris deemed it "Beyond the Best" (a 10 on a scale of 1 - 5). Melanna Marcleot is not a fan of raw fish but

noted that she loved the rice pilaf served alongside the tuna, as did Linda Wilson with special appreciation for the snow peas.

And last but not least, the Creole Jambalaya is a Louisiana Classic, thick with chicken, Andouille sausage and vegetables, slow cooked and served with rice and Creole sauce. Lisa Siegert-Free considered the jambalaya to be a unique dish with great flavor. While Linda Hyrckowian and Joseph Staron both gave the Jambalaya high marks, it was interesting to note that the dish was a little too spicy for Linda Wilson and just right for Bev Trout, and both Eric Johnson and David Irwin would have enjoyed a little more spice.

Following an incredible array of culinary extravaganza, Main St. Grill topped it off with a house favorite, Bread Pudding, prepared with baked peaches and bread and topped with warm vanilla rum sauce which screams "Share Me!" As "a personal favorite" for Lisa Siegert-Free, everyone had their own words for the infamous dessert: "Superb" for Noel Harris, "Amazing!" for Stephanie Woodruff, and "the Best" for Bryan Coffey. Sherrie Schaefer raved about the fantastic sauce - "so decadent!" and Eric Johnson definitively named the finale "The Topper".



intimacy of sharing the event with members of the community.


