

Ronnie and Dierdre Leave KC to Discover Bravo! Vail and Singletree

It is hard to imagine Ronnie Baker as a hyperactive child as he calmly shares the roots of his lifelong passion for music. Growing up in Kansas City, his parents worried about him as he ran through the neighborhood and the streets at the age of 5, an energy that his parents literally tried to leash with a harness and a clothesline. Ronnie's parents also believed that he "needed culture," so in a further attempt to control his unbridled energy, his Mother would play Peter and the Wolf on the console 78 record player in his grandparents' home. As he grew older, his love for music led Ronnie to save his allowance to take the bus downtown to see the Kansas City Philharmonic Symphony perform. Little did they know that those musical

a rich life in Singletree and a deep commitment to Bravo! Vail. Ronnie and his wife, Dierdre, used to plan their vacations to the Vail Valley for one week every winter and one week in the summer. In 1993, they discovered Bravo! and from that point on, went about planning their summer trips around the concert calendar. Ronnie, an avid Kansas University basketball fan, had learned a valuable trick about securing event tickets: those hard-to-get seats, passed down from generation to generation, became surprisingly available with a nominal donation.

With this practical wisdom in mind, Ronnie shares his thoughts: "When we considered what Bravo! brings to the Vail Valley in terms of education, entertainment and culture, on a year-round basis, we determined this organization was worthwhile of our support. And by about 2002, we started spending significantly more time in Colorado – a month at time – attending more and more concerts and becoming increasingly familiar with Bravo!"

Ronnie enthusiastically explains, "Bravo! Vail provides an opportunity for children to enjoy music education." As he recalls his first experience with Peter and the Wolf, he continues, "If we can provide the same experience for children, I believe it is well worth its while. At the end of the day, when you look back at life, it has nothing to do with the zeroes behind your name. It's about what you have done. It's about making a difference; it doesn't have to be about 100 people, it could be one."







Surprisingly, most people are not really aware of everything Bravo! Vail has to offer. After Ronnie and Dierdre made the permanent move to the Vail Valley in 2006, Ronnie volunteered as a host for the Town of Vail in an effort to meet people as well as to help people who were visiting the Valley. "I wanted to engage with our guests and to make them feel welcome and appreciated. I would ask them, 'Do you know about Bravo! Vail?' And they would have no clue about the small trek to the Betty Ford Gardens and the Amphitheater. So, I would tell them all the wonderful things about the organization; I would share with them what Bravo! accomplishes in terms of education for young people and the entire community. I encouraged our guests to look at **all** the wonderful things our valley offers."

As further evidence of his commitment to Bravo! Vail, Ronnie joined the Board in 2010. "It's important as a resident to support the things that make our valley great to ensure that these things continue," he says. "We can get involved, and we can make a difference." Ronnie is also quick to give credit where credit is due and attributes much of the success of the organization to its incredibly wonderful staff. "Many of the staff have been there for years; they love the organization, they love what they do, and they work tirelessly year round to organize and execute numerous events." Ronnie feels fortunate to have had the opportunity to get to know the founding director, John Giovando, and, today, holds Caitlin Murray, the current CEO, and Anne Marie McDermott, Bravo Artistic Director, in the highest regard.

The Bravo! Vail team recognizes the importance of serving the needs of the entire community – ages 6 to 106. "It is so heartwarming to see such a wide variety of music being presented," says Ronnie. In addition to the summer series featuring The Chamber



Orchestra Vienna- Berlin, The Dallas Symphony Orchestra, the Philadelphia Orchestra, and the New York Philharmonic at Ford Amphitheater, the highlights of the 2019 season include a movie night where The Dallas Symphony will perform the score of *Jurassic Park* while the movie is shown overhead. It was 25 years ago when two women set out to do what they could to work against breast cancer. Brenda Himelfarb founded the Vail Breast Cancer Awareness Group (VBCAG) with Singletree resident Patti Weinstein, and at that time there weren't any local groups supporting those that were diagnosed with the disease.

"Patti's mother-in-law had died from breast cancer, and my closest friend had been diagnosed. We chose not to align with a national organization, as we felt they took too much money out of the community, and we wanted all the money to stay in Eagle County," Brenda recalls. "None of our board members are paid, and we have no paid employees."

Many of those volunteer board members are Singletree residents, including Mark and Heidi Bricklin. Mark is Brenda's son, and he has lost many friends and family members to cancer. Brenda is actually a breast cancer survivor and ironically started the VB-CAG before her diagnosis. "Our organization will not be the one to eradicate this cancer, but our little effort has done wonders for patients recently diagnosed with breast cancer," says Mark.

Some of those "little efforts" aren't so little. Over the past 25 years, the VBCAG has raised money to put toward the purchase of equipment for the Sonnenalp Breast Center. In addition to equipment like a PET scanner, a stereotactic table and a 3D tomography machine, the VBCAG focuses on the non-scientific side of cancer.

"We provide a Day to Play gift of \$500 to each person diagnosed with breast cancer in Eagle County, and they can use that money as they wish. We also give everyone diagnosed a Shine On Bag filled with a plush bathrobe and many other 'feel-good,' gifts such as lotions, soaps, bath salts and books," Brenda explains. Last year the VBCAG teamed up with Chef Weston, a private chef, to prepare Meals to Heal, which provides two weeks' worth of meals for those beginning chemotherapy.

Singletree resident and VBCAG board member Deb Douglas joined the board two years ago, and has had several friends and family members diagnosed with breast cancer as well. "We lost our daughter-in-law after a seven-year battle with breast cancer. The struggles that cancer presents are many, and what the VB-CAG does has touched people so deeply. I know that it profoundly affected Kerri in such a positive way. It is wonderful to be able to support patients," Deb fondly remembers.

Lori Brown has been on the VBCAG board for six years, and the timing was perfect; she and her husband had just become empty-nesters, and after many years as a volunteer in the locals schools and being involved in multiple fundraisers, she was ready to take on the role of being a board member for a charitable cause. Lori's favorite part about being involved with the VBCAG is hearing the feedback from those the organization helps. "I love reading the thank-you notes that we receive. It's melts my heart to hear how much they appreciate what we as an organization have done for them during a very difficult time in their life," Lori reflects. "Their thanks and appreciation gives so much meaning to what we're doing."

Tricia Swenson, also from Singletree, joined the VBCAG after her college roommate died of breast cancer in 2017. "You just feel so helpless when you lose someone, so this was my way of doing something to give back and help others with the disease," Tricia said.

Tricia had known about the organization for years and had attended their annual Celebration of Life luncheon several times. "I was always impressed with the wonderful speakers and the inspirational messages they shared," Tricia says looking back on those memorable events. Some of her favorite speakers from past events include Linda Ellerbee, Robin Roberts, Elizabeth Edwards, Joy Behar, Giuliana and Bill Rancic and last year's speaker, Dorothy Hamill.

The 2019 Celebration of Life Luncheon will take place July 26 at the Vail Marriott featuring award-winning journalist, author, women's health and wellness advocate and breast-cancer survivor Joan Lunden as the featured speaker. For tickets, please call 970-479-8595, or visit www.vbcag.org.





Devoting His Life to Making Music and Connections

Gary is as jovial as ever during our meeting, with a list of notes and an outline for his article, and a big smile as a greeting at The Arrowhead Club. "I'm not sure what you want to focus on, so I wrote out everything for you," he laughs. Since retirement, Gary has kept very busy within the musical community of Vail, filling the role of production manager for Vail Jazz, performing with his trumpet at ceremonial occasions, and lending that talent to the Alpine Wind Ensemble.

"Well, I've been performing, or shall I say, playing, the trumpet since I was very young," says Gary. In fact, he credits the trumpet with his very existence! "My father played the trumpet and led the band in the Navy. He escaped Normandy because while he was on his way onto the ship, a superior sent out an emergency message that Thornton couldn't leave because he was needed to lead the band," Gary recalls. His eyes alight with amusement as he retells his chosen origin story. "I guess you could say that without music, and without the trumpet, I wouldn't be here, since I was born in '44!"

Singletree readers may recall Gary's tales of his days in the Coast Guard and how his love of music thrived during his career. But he says it really took off when they moved here to the Vail Valley. "Patti and I became key supporters and volunteered at running venues for Vail Jazz the third year it started," he recalls. "I became production manager and Patti became overall operations manager." During their time in operations, Vail Jazz truly blossomed into what it is today, with a Gary-inspired direction focused on three signature education programs and six unique performance series.

Gary really wants to bring his love of jazz to the youth of the valley and valleys beyond. "Under the Vail Valley Foundation, I was recruited to do 'First Notes,' an after-school music program to teach trumpets and trombones. I teach trumpet out of my home and in the kids' homes, still!" Jazz, he says, is an interactive form of musical expression that includes the audience, and that's what makes it so special and so appealing to many young musicians.

Because he was known for his love of connecting as well as his love of music, Gary was approached by a representative of the Vilar Performing Arts Center who knew of his involvement in a wide range of musical endeavors. A woman named Christine Gary bequeathed money to be used in a non-specific way to educate youth in music. "I had no initial ideas," laughs Gary, "but I discovered Rocky Ridge Music Center in Estes Park that has music camps all summer long." He decided to create a scholarship program to get the talented children of this valley who otherwise couldn't afford a week there to experience "a Juilliard of music in the Rocky Mountains," says Gary.

For the past eight years, four to five students have been gifted full tuition for 12-day music camps. "This year we have three Eagle Valley students and two Battle Mountain students. We send freshmen and sophomores, because we want them to bring back their newly discovered skills to share with their peers and the valley long before they head off to college," Gary chuckles.

He is working with the Vilar and Bravo to develop a continual source of funds for this program, since this is the last year of funding. "I've talked to everyone, I'm a connector in my free time," he says. "I've made enough of an impression that I'm now on the Board of Directors for the Rocky Ridge Music Center, and we have a Benefit Gala at the Denver Opera House this summer titled 'Intermezzo at the Ellie."

Though Gary is a self-proclaimed jazz enthusiast, he clearly loves all forms of musical expression, especially when it comes to family and country. Gary and Patti's love of jazz and desire to bring it to the youth of the valley grew up with their son, Kristofer. "I kind of got away from playing until Kristofer attended ECCA, and I became assistant band director," Gary remembers. "We played Taps together, as shown in this photograph, and we played what is called 'Echo Taps,' where we separate ourselves, and we go back and forth with the call," he muses as his eyes get misty. "It's very moving, performing in honor of the fallen," he reflects.

He looks down and the silence fills the moment. He begins to speak again. "Last week at Ride of Remembrance, someone asked me how my son was doing, and remembered our Echo Taps. It's been a few years since we've played together, and you can't underestimate the impact you are making in these ceremonial events." He sighs heavily. "Last year, a special forces officer died in a parachute accident, and his friends came and gave eulogies, and there I am standing, listening to all of these stories and memories, and then when it was my turn to play Taps, I had to really dig deep in order to play."

Now in all the spare time he has, Gary plays for his own amusement and love of the music with a small group of other brass artists known as the Alpine Wind Ensemble. They have played the Fourth of July parade, Flag Days of Eagle, Alpine Club, Vail Tree Lighting, BM and VCC. They also play at the Christie Lodge and at the Castle Peak Senior Center. 
Orchestra once a month, and we play as wind and brass at Jack's Place; that's very special," says Gary.

Perched atop Las Vistas are eight homes which are called "The Ridge at Las Vistas." This special spot is truly a unique oasis for peace and serenity, and the perfect home for Paul and Carol LaLena.

Paul recalls, "George (Gregory) and Alida (Zwaan) bought this pre-construction, and I bought it and closed on it in December 2007." Paul has been a resident of Singletree since 1990, and moved to The Ridge from his prior home on Hereford. "Someone made me an offer on my house on Hereford that I could not refuse. That house was way too big – 4,000 feet with six bedrooms and six and a half baths," he explains. At 2,600 square feet with three bedrooms and an entertainment room, this is an ideal fit.



Since it was pre-construction, only the framing was in place. "We chose everything but the in-floor heat, which George and Alida installed, otherwise, we chose the flooring, the slate, the tile, the carpeting, all the bathroom fixtures, light fixtures and ceiling fans. 

A LAWN CHAIR

Born in 1984 during Vail's July 4 parade, a group of happy Valley locals created a hilarious act called "Vail's Precision Lawn Chair Demonstration Team" (PLCDT) in order to "meet babes and get free beer from restaurants and bars." (The team member actually quoted with that particular line will, for obvious reasons, forever remain anonymous.) The crowd went wild and – except for that one year no one is willing to talk about – we have never missed the annual parade throughout Vail Village and Lionshead.

The following years led to a Heath Candy Bar commercial filmed in Hollywood, Warren Miller Ski Movies, a reality TV show called "30 Seconds of Fame", a full page spread in People Magazine and multiple performances statewide for conventions and other special events like NBA halftime games and even a few times for NFL and MLB games including a Bronco halftime performance with the team performing on the 50 yard line surrounded by a couple hundred high school cheerleaders.

After faltering participation in the early '90s, our team was resurrected of sorts after being chosen to represent the State of Colorado during the 1993 Presidential Inauguration for Bill Clinton in Washington, D.C. At 9:00 a.m. on January 20, 1993, the PLCDT owned Pennsylvania Avenue. An eight-lane avenue lined with literally tens of thousands of spectators held back by hundreds of D.C.'s finest, and nary a soul on the street, except for 16 extremely proud Vail Valley men (and two gorgeous Banner

Babes) wearing Hawaiian shirts and effortlessly flipping lawn chairs with the precision of a drunken juggler. It was a moment worthy of the Star Spangled Banner.

The following years brought TV commercials with major ski resorts (yes, Vail Resorts) which led to TV interviews with the likes of Erma Bombeck and Bob Beattie, all leading to the pinnacle of TV fame – a Miller Lite 'Less Filling-Great Taste' ad filmed over four gloriously hellacious days on the bikini-filled beaches surrounding the Santa Monica Pier.

And then eight years later lightning struck a second time. For whatever reason, and trust me when I say many were searching for them, we were invited back to Washington, D.C. to do it all over again, and this time for George Bush's Inaugural Parade in 2001.

Live on Good Morning America with Tony Perkins, followed by a humorous discussion between Charlie Gibson and Diane Sawyer. Taped appearances with FOX and CBS went national, showing up also on the FOX NEWS channel, the WB network, CNN, MSNBC, TV8, C-Span, and even the superficial "Extra-Extra!" Seventeen radio shows spanning the globe from Eugene, Oregon to Boca Raton, Florida all the way to the BBC in London. In fact, three separate divisions within the BBC did three separate interviews; all transmitted live throughout Western Europe. Every time we were introduced as being from beautiful Vail, Colorado. All this





was followed by not one, but two, appearances in the Vail Valley Charitable Foundation's "Undressed Calendars," which is exactly what you think – locals doing what they do best, in the buff.

The wave of national publicity has taken years to mellow out, and even though our personal appearances are not as frequent anymore, we still consider the Vail 4th of July parade an annual rite of passage, for the crowds of course, but also for team members and now even our children. My son, Oliver, first appeared with the team in 2000. At 2 years old, he joined us on stage at a CDOT convention in Denver in front of 1,000 people. Oliver knew how to flip a smaller lawn chair just enough to be dangerous and literally stole the show. That began his training for what has become 19 more years of flipping lawn chairs, and for the past 10 years or so, he has been a full-fledged member performing alongside the team whenever the calls come in.

Many of the team's members have followed suit and this year for the 4th of July parade, you'll see many teenagers marching alongside their aging fathers celebrating the 35th anniversary of Lawn Chair history and hopefully, we'll be here for many more years to come!


