I enrolled at the University of Detroit and earned my DDS. I now felt prepared to "launch". I had been in Michigan long enough and I foresaw the decline of Detroit. If not London or Paris, at least give me New York or LA!

A friend had recently moved to Washington, DC. I visited him and in four days, found an apartment, a job, and a small circle of friends. During the next 30 years, I built a large dental

practice in the suburb of Laurel, MD. We focused on high technology, such as laser dentistry. I had already started "seeing the world", but I resolved to get more proactive. I committed to taking a short trip every month and four extended trips per year. It was the only way to see it all.

For the next 3 decades, my life changed little. I was working, travelling and loving Washington, DC, still my favorite US city. I had close ties with my sister and her family, and my daughter, who has grown up to be a source of great joy to me to this day, even providing me the opportunity to be a grandfather.

Early in my 50's, two things changed. I began to dream of living in a moun-

We dated and travelled, spent time in Vail skiing and she moved into my place at Watergate. I proposed at the top of Ricky's Ridge, we were married at my sister's lakeside home and honeymooned in Greece.

We also began to plan for our "escape". During 18 hectic months, I bought one dental practice and sold two, I sold my Watergate and Vail condos and we purchased an East Vail townhome. I recredentialled in Colorado and found a job. Karin sold her mother's house, relocated her to Cherry Creek, and secured a job at Gorsuch. Our wedding and honeymoon took place in that busy 18 months. As promised, Karin will share her early years before we met...

While Joe grew up the quintessential all-American boy, I was born into a military family and was, as Joe fondly refers to me, an army brat. My father was stationed in Germany when he met his future German wife on a tennis court. After marrying in Germany, Dad brought his new bride to New York and I was born two years later in Buffalo. Dad was then assigned to Bamberg, Germany, where I was raised for my first 10 years speaking German as my first language.

Later, Dad was stationed in the Washington, DC area and I attended the University of Maryland where I earned a degree in Merchandising Marketing. After graduation, I moved to the "Big Apple" and was accepted into Boomingdales' Executive Buying Program. Working long hours and stretched thin on a retail salary, I moved back to DC to be the buyer for a family owned fabric and leather upholstery business. 
#### BOB AND JUDY HOLMES Encourage Volunteering at Roundup River Ranch:

Help Campers with Serious Illnesses Feel Like ORDINARY KIDS

Singletree has been our weekend retreat for the past four years, but this year, we were finally able to make it our full-time home. We look forward to a future filled with more skiing, hiking, golfing, and meeting new friends. One of the many wonderful aspects of living in the Vail Valley is being more involved with the Roundup River Ranch. We were introduced to the organization by our dear friend and fellow attorney, Ruth Johnson. She has been the President and CEO of Roundup River Ranch since its inception, and her dedication to and passion for its mission is contagious. The more we learned about Roundup River Ranch from her, the more excited we were to become involved.

Roundup River Ranch is part of the SeriousFun Children's Network, a global community of medical specialty camps founded by Paul Newman. He founded the first "Hole-In-The-Wall Gang" camp in 1988 for children with serious illnesses and their families. He believed that children with serious illnesses should have the chance to go to summer camp to experience adventures, make friends, and for a time be able to forget their medical struggles. That wonderful idea has grown from one camp in Connecticut to 30 "SeriousFun" camps and programs worldwide. Each SeriousFun camp is independently managed and financed, carrying out Paul Newman's vision.

Several years ago, a group of very dedicated, amazing people (including our Singletree neighbor, Liz Stern) raised enough money to bring a SeriousFun camp to Colorado. They bought a beautiful piece of property near Dotsero and Roundup River Ranch was created. The first campers were welcomed in



2011, and the organization continues to grow every year. This year, Roundup River Ranch will provide over 1,600 camper experiences from ages 7 to 17. Since its opening, Roundup River Ranch has provided over 6,000 camper experiences.

Roundup River Ranch has the ability to host children who live with serious illnesses such as brain tumors, cancer, celiac disease, kidney disease, epilepsy, heart disease, and lung disease. In fact, the outstanding medical facilities and the dedicated medical staff and volunteers can accommodate more than 50 different types of serious medical conditions. The campers receive individualized medical care from outstanding medical professionals who come from Colorado and many other states to volunteer their time at camp.

Campers attend camp for a week, where they meet other children who are experiencing similar health challenges. Camp is often the first time they have been away from home or the hospital for any extended time. Campers are able to come together to develop friendships, learn from each other, and realize their potential in a safe environment. They gain confidence as they experience new challenges and succeed in ways they never thought possible. The talented staff and volunteers make sure that even something like a wheelchair or walker won't stop a camper from experiencing the Challenge Course, Equestrian Program, or a trip down the Zipline.

The entire camp experience at Roundup River Ranch is provided at no cost to the families. It is all funded through donations from individuals, businesses, foundations, and the community.

#### **Roundup River Ranch Changes Lives**

One of the most rewarding aspects of working with Roundup River Ranch is meeting the amazing campers and their families. It is inspiring to listen to their stories about how camp has affected their lives.

One camper's mother described how her daughter's week at camp was "truly transformational." In a thank you letter to Roundup River Ranch, she described how her daughter had experienced a very difficult year of medical setbacks and school bullying. The following summer, she was able to attend camp, and that experience had a profound, lasting effect on her: "It was the change in her spirit that was the most amazing, and for that we are eternally grateful. She learned that she is strong enough, smart enough, and talented enough to stand on her own."

#### 1st Place: LOVE ME TENDER BACK - Robert Grauer

In anticipation of a competitive rib-off, Ursula carefully prepared her sauce and the ribs to be entered as "Love Me Tender". At about noon-ish the day of the event, I decided to enter my own "Love Me Tender Back" since we had leftover ribs.

I prepared a rub with a combination of spices I thought would be tasty, including salt, pepper, paprika and Mt. Elbert seasoning. I put the ribs in the pressure cooker, which is the real secret to tenderness. About 2 hours later, after a nap, the meat was falling off the bone. A bit of basting with Ursula's secret sauce and a few minutes on the grill "et voila"... the winning ribs! But Ursula definitely deserves the credit for the sauce.

#### **Ursula's Secret Sauce:**

- 1 bottle Bull's-Eye Original BBQ Sauce
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon chile pequin

#### 2nd Place: OLÉ RIBS – JP Power

- · 1 rack of baby back ribs
- 4 parts: Joy's of the Southwest Cherry Olé\*
- · 1 part: Joy's of the Southwest Jalapeño Jam\*\*
- · 2 bottles Guinness Stout



Marinate the ribs in the Cherry Ole and Jalapeño Jam for at least four hours or overnight. Soak mesquite chips in water for one hour. Light the grill and when the coals are ready, add the chips and grill the ribs for a long time at 225 - 250 degrees. If you are using a gas grill, place the mesquite in a smoking basket but keep the heat between 225 - 250 degrees

When the ribs are fall-off-the-bone tender, pour the Guinness into a

pan; place the pan on the grill rack, place an open grate over the Guinness pan and place the ribs on the grate. Continue the low heat grilling for one more hour.

#### 3rd Place: PORK-O-LICIOUS -**Kevin Calabrese**

- · 1 rack of baby back ribs
- 1/4 cup white wine vinegar
- 2 teaspoons kosher salt

#### For the Marinade:

- · 1 tablespoon hoisin sauce
- ½ cup soy sauce
- ½ cup brown sugar
- ½ cup ketchup
- ½ cup lemon juice
- · 3 tablespoons honey
- 2 tables spoons diced ginger
- · 2 tablespoons diced garlic

Brine the ribs in water mixed with the white wine vinegar and 2 tsp salt for 8 - 10 hours. Remove the ribs from the brine. Bring the brining liquid to a boil, add the ribs, and boil for 20 minutes. Remove the ribs from the brine and pour the marinade



over the ribs. Marinate the ribs for 4 - 6 hours, turning occasionally. Remove the ribs from the marinade and reserve the marinade. Put the marinade into a saucepan; bring to a boil then reduce heat to a simmer. Simmer until the marinade thickens slightly.

Grill the ribs over medium heat until slightly charred, basting with the thickened marinade.

Garnish with sesame seeds and chopped green onion and serve.

there is no typical year. Some years are more balanced than others. In those years, snow comes and goes with healthy accumulation, yielding to warmer temperatures during our wonderful summers. Then there are years when the forces of nature are out of balance. The snow comes late or not at all, creating drought or fire danger during the summer. Or, record snowfalls give way to an unseasonably cold and wet spring and early summer. Each scenario creates its own set of adventures and challenges. While our atmosphere takes an impact, so does our ability to make a living.

We are fortunate to have an organization in our community that rises to meet such imbalances. Volunteering for the Vail Valley Salvation Army for the past 10 years has opened my eyes to all they do to silently support our community in times of need.

Their world-wide slogan is "Doing the Most Good", which is exactly what they do for our local community. They respond to fire, flood, and road closures as well as fight food insecurity within our community.

Remember December 2017? No snow equaled no work for many of our low-income community members, who were already stretching their dollars waiting for the winter season to kick in. That month, and the subsequent winter, we saw a dramatic increase in the need for food and other services just to help families 'stay afloat'. It amazes me that our local Salvation Army can do all this with just two paid staff members. While this small team is the heart and soul or the organization, so is the literal red army of volunteers that show up time and time again to get the work done.

The Vail Valley Salvation Army serves nearly 500 households per month through their food pantry to any person in need. Aside from this, they manage 100 additional food boxes per month of USDA commodities which families may qualify for based on income level. When a family experiences sudden tragedy, including displacement from their home, the Salvation Army is there with help. Services include assistance for rent, utilities, transportation, and emergency prescriptions.

Additionally, the Salvation Army offers support for stranded motorists and provides comfort to travelers during road closures. They

take the front line in supporting first responders for forest fires. They served three wildfires in ten days amounting to over 5,000 meals during the 2018 fire season. They do this out of a modest mobile canteen staffed entirely by volunteers. These are the nitty gritty details of keeping our community food secure and safe in disaster or tragedy.

In recent years, a beautiful detail has morphed from the sweat equity of the team. Behind the food pantry is a community garden complete with greenhouses, compost, beehives, picnic tables, and a playhouse. Community members can qualify for a plot within the garden for \$5 per month. Most importantly, the garden contributes fresh produce to the food pantry in this self-sustaining model. Garden staff offers outreach and education to adults and children alike. The Vail Valley Salvation Army is in our schools and frequently hosts children to the garden through a program called Growing Gardeners. They are not only teaching our children how to grow food but how to do it sustainably.

The Vail Valley Salvation Army receives operating funds in a variety of ways. Most importantly, they need you. They need you to fill the iconic red kettles during the holiday season, unload food trucks, sort food in the pantry, work in the garden, volunteer for fundraising events or participate in the fundraising events.

Three events will take place in the next few months where you can help as a volunteer or a participant: EMPTY BOWLS, the HARVEST DINNER and the RED KETTLE GOLF TOURNAMENT.

**EMPTY BOWLS** is in its 11th year and takes place on Friday, August 16th from noon - 1:30 pm at Battle Mountain High School. A group of community members started this 'soup line' with the intent to fortify the food pantry with donations. Generous potters provide their artwork: an empty bowl to remind us of hunger in the Vail

Valley and around the world. Talented chefs use the bounty of late summer vegetables and ingredients to serve soup, bread, and dessert. Emergency responders and volunteers serve it all at this community spirited lunch. Tickets are \$25 at the door.

The **HARVEST DINNER** takes place on Thursday, September 5th from 5 pm - 7 pm. This annual event is held in the garden itself at the Salvation Army in Avon. It's a true farm to table event prepared by local chefs with local food to support our greenhouse and community garden.

The RED KETTLE GOLF TOUR-NAMENT is held on Thursday, September 12th at the Cordillera Valley Course. This 17th annual tournament is accepting sponsors, players and volunteers. Players receive goodie bags, breakfast, lunch and after-play hors d'oeuvres, all while enjoying a members-only exclusive golf course. Give back to your community while having fun on the links! Sponsorships start at \$250; a team of four is \$1,000.

The Vail Valley Salvation Army supports our community in so many ways, it only makes sense for myself and my family to give our time, sweat and donations to support them. It's



#### Culminating in a Dream Home at 123 Howard Drive



Sharp peaks cut the brilliant blue sky, pulling your eye upwards to the heavens. Like a climber assessing a new line, the face of the home at 123 Howard Drive invites visitors to challenge their notions of what lies inside the walls. While there is no doubt that this mountain modern home is influenced by the classic mid-century design that has made a popular comeback in recent years, this home definitely represents the new build aesthetic taking over the hearts and minds and Pinterest drool-worthy "dream house" pages of our technological generation.

Owners Alex and Robin Coleman knew exactly what they wanted to build the second they saw the single family lot on the fairway of the 16th hole of the Sonnenalp golf course. "As a builder, I knew I wanted to focus on building a home with three ideas: steel,

glass, and barn wood," Alex recalls. "I have spent 20 years doing homes that are all stone and log, and it just dominates the space." He looks over at his living room wall that is bottom to top barn wood and steel, and smiles. "I find that heavy stone is something your home gets married to, and it's hard to change it; the one feature that guests remember is how big and dominating the fireplace is in your home. We didn't want that."

The master bedroom has an entire wall of its own barn wood that echoes the main living space. "We aren't art people, per se," says Alex. "We just knew that a feature wall would really tie this project together and create drama without a massive art piece." The wood they selected is a very natural grey-washed barn wood. "All of this barn wood is from a reclaimed snow fence in Wyoming," Alex explains as he runs his hands over the wood. "Creative Floors supplied it and we just love it." Accent walls as well as little touches of the barn wood in the kitchen and bathrooms are found throughout the home, "Honestly, that's mostly Sian Christie's design ideas; I just knew I wanted glass everywhere and for it to be modern but warm."

As the owner of Coleman Construction, Alex builds homes all over the valley but in this case, he knew he had to put his ego aside and hire a design team to give life to the vision in his mind. "Sian Christie and Olivia Grayson of Grayson + Christie Interior Design were just wonderful," he says. "After doing this for 20 years, I was like, no way do I need a designer. I got this. But it was 100% worth it and the whole process was so easy as

son, Zander, was 3 at the time we were planning, so we wanted his play area to be in the front of the house." Very practical planning from a parenting and entertainment perspective.

The Colemans also knew that they wanted to enjoy main-level living, with guest rooms above the garage space, and as a result, the footprint was designed perfectly for this family of three. N.D.G. Architecture laid out the ideal floor plan per the Coleman's "must have" list. Everything a home needs for modern convenience has been designed and created here: a large open entertaining area with full views of both the front and back yards, his and hers closets of equal size, a beautiful and functional mudroom and powder room close to the garage, a family den next to Zander's suite, and a tucked away office space.

"We wanted a house that was main-level specific, but had the potential for an entire guest or children's wing with its own den, you know, planning for the future," says Alex. Zander's room was designed with an active kid in mind! What could have potentially been a boring bedroom is a child's paradise for imagination, with stairs leading up to a large sleeping loft for friends and playful nooks for toys and creations from floor to ceiling. The staircase up to the guest rooms is a genius moment in design choices: instead of railings, the staircase incorporates open pops of glass walls to allow light from the windows onto the opposite side of the space.

"It's just something we thought would be interesting," he smiles. And it most certainly is just that!

What did Alex learn about building from the construction of his own family home, you might ask? "Doing my own house was super smooth. The more you pick out and the more homework and research you do before you start, the better it all goes. Everything was on time. We were able to make decisions up front, and from start to finish, this construction took us 4 months and 3 weeks," he proudly states. "We planned it all really well. For instance, we had the cabinets for the kitchen and bathrooms on order and set to arrive before we put our first shovel in the ground." As for budget, which is a notorious place to lose your shirt in construction, the Colemans kept it simple. "There were no crazy bathtubs or granite countertops that we allowed ourselves to fall in love with during this process. We picked out everything and then never went shopping again. We came in only \$10,000 over budget, and I can blame that all on Sian our designer... sorry Sian!" he laughs.

It all started with the perfect lot and the vision of a home featuring steel, glass, and barn wood. With proper planning and the end result clearly in mind, the Colemans made what can often be a challenging process straightforward and fun... and today, Alex, Robin and Zander live happily in the perfect home for their family!

The house is set off Howard further back than every site surrounding it, which gives the home a very dream-like quality that hearkens to Arapahoe Acres in Englewood, CO, with its historic mid-century homes featuring butterfly roofs and expansive inviting front yards. "I pushed the build site on this lot all the way back; I had to go through the DRB to get special approval," Alex says as he gestures from the front door out to the sprawling grassy area. "We knew that being on the golf course in the middle of the fairway put us right in a target zone for golfers' drives. Our

- · Remember when a supply emergency has been issued, the Water District may prohibit outdoor water use and increase fines for violations of the Water Use Regulations.

#### Water Wise Landscaping -



• Limit turf area by incorporating native or adapted water-wise plants.

- · Keep soil healthy and aerate lawns,
- Use non-combustible mulch to retain moisture.
- Incorporate swales and berms into landscapes to slow runoff and prevent from leaving yards.

#### Water Wise Tips -



- Install a "smart" sprinkler control system or manually adjust the sprinkler program when it rains.
- Reduce sprinkler durations as we approach mid-August; growth has already occurred.
- · Review your water bill to understand your summer water use.
