THE COMMUNITY MARKET

Shortly after the onset of Covid-19, Michael Slevin was motivated by a Vail Daily News article report ing that the Eagle Valley Community Foundation's Community Market had seen a 300% increase in traffic due to business closings. 
of Eagle County through voter registration and education. This was particularly appealing as the non-partisan group promotes its values without being identified with, or tied to, any political party.






