

We have all heard them. Those family stories that make you a little sick when you consider what could have been. The pragmatic decision that was sound at the time, but in hindsight seems so foolish. Singletree resident Kathy Bellamy has one of those stories. It happened back in 1978.

She was at her home in Dallas
Texas listening to close family
friend and then Vail Associates
chairman Harry Bass tell her and
her husband about a new development called Beaver Creek. Bass
told the couple that he had studied
the development of Aspen and Vail
and intended to make Beaver Creek
more profitable than either resort.
His plan was to develop a mountain
and sell off homesites and condominium sites, like Vail, but also to
retain ownership of a large percentage of the commercial core.

With that, Bass cleared the dining room table, unrolled a map of the area that would become Beaver Creek, and invited the couple to be initial investors in the project. Still shell-shocked from the stagnate economy of the late '70s and skeptical of Bass's big plans given his poor performance at Vail, they politely declined the offer. Little did Kathy know that one day Beaver Creek would be her home. Fast forward 43 years and now three generations of Kathy and Mike's family are living and working in the area on Harry Bass's map. Kathy's two sons and five of her grandchildren all live work and play in the area.

Kathy Bellamy moved to the Valley in 2001. A native Texan, Kathy was living and working as a realtor in Atlanta when she decided to finally chase her dreams of the mountains. At the time of the move Kathy's three children,

Matt, Elizabeth, and Michael were off starting their own adult lives so it seemed like an appropriate time to load her dog in the car and set off for the mountains. She purchased a townhome in Mission Ridge that was a short drive from her oldest son, Matt Jones, a chef, who had moved to the Valley a few years earlier and was just starting a family. Soon thereafter she got a job selling real estate with Slifer Smith and Frampton, which she still continues and enjoys today.

A true Michigander at heart, Mike Williams followed a different path to Eagle County. Following a long Army career that covered multiple tours in Vietnam, Mike followed his passion for skiing to the mountains of California. Always a teacher, Mike started in the late 1970s as an instructor near Truckee where he raised his two daughters, Sarah and Suzannah. In the mid-1990s, when his girls were grown, Mike left the heavy snow of the Sierra and headed east for better slopes and dry powder. Taking a job with the Beaver Creek ski school, Mike settled into what he thought would be a peaceful bachelor's life in the mountains. Little did he know how short-lived this dream would be

Kathy and Mike met in 2004 and were married in 2007. Immediately it became apparent that the Mission Ridge home wouldn't accommodate the constant flow of adult children,

so the couple moved to a bigger place on Foal Circle. They never thought of leaving Singletree. Kathy, an outdoor enthusiast, makes use of the trails above Charolais Circle and June Creek during all times of the year. Mike, a retired PGA teaching professional, loves the convenient golf access. Content with their surround ings, Mike and Kathy live busy lives, involved with both their family and the surrounding community.

The couple moved one more time in 2017, this time to a home on Charolais Circle. In the community, Mike is a longtime volunteer with the Salvation Army, feeding and supplying countless firefighters over the years. In 2020, after three years of intensive study, Mike was ordained by the Episcopal Church. Mike currently works as the Deacon for the Episcopal Church of the Transfiguration, revitalizing the church's outreach to the community. Mike and Kathy also give back by serving people via the Eagle County Community Supper program.

Kathy's youngest son, Michael Brownlee, graduated from Auburn University before attending law school at St. Mary's University in San Antonio, Texas. During law school, Michael was introduced to his wife Taylor. Taylor, a graduate of the University of Texas at Austin, was raised in a small town in North Texas and was working as an

There was so much excitement from first-time voters including college students that I talked to who wanted to make sure their ballots got to them in college. We always work in bipartisan teams, and other duties included taking/ picking up ballots from the Eagle County jail, the post office, and Castle Peak senior center (due to Covid restrictions).

To anyone who thinks there is fraud in our voting system, come be an Election Judge, and you will be able to explain to people what a provisional ballot is, curing signatures, and why vote by mail is secure. Regina and

her team do an amazing job under high stress and 14 hour days and weekends for weeks leading up to the election and should be commended. I can't wait to be an Election Judge this year!

#### JERRY KATZ

I've enjoyed several benefits in working as an Eagle County election judge. First, is the personal pleasure of offering a service to the county and those who live in Eagle County. Second, is the pleasure of working with Regina and her wonderful staff and the other election judges. Third, is the satisfaction I have in seeing, from the inside, how the county's election procedures help ensure the integrity of the election process. This is particularly

important in these times.





example of our neighbors committed to making a difference by giving back. Traci and Mike have lived in volunteering with the Alzheimer's






Association since 2018 when they became involved with the first Walk To End Alzheimer's in the Vail Valley. They have been committed advocates for the organiza-

Both of the Wodlingers are retired. Traci was the chief strategy officer for the Eagle County School District and Mike was an investment advisor at Raymond James Financial.

Generally, one of the first questions I ask when I interview folks for these articles is what drew them to the cause they are supporting. When I asked Traci and Mike this question I was, frankly, surprised by their answer. Most folks have experienced



Mike and Traci realized that anything affecting brain function was so devastating that it deserved their attention. They coupled that with a strong desire to give back to a community that had provided them with so much and a commitment was formed. In addition, Mike made a very interesting point when he said that, to him, Alzheimer's research today is where cancer research was 20 years ago, and he and Traci wanted to do whatever they could to move that research forward. They also realized that while our Valley is blessed with wonderful physicians capable of dealing with virtually any physical issue that might arise, Alzheimer's is essentially unfixable. They were determined to do all they could to change that.

So, also in 2018, they volunteered to help with the first Walk To End Alzheimer's in the Valley.

The Walk raises money by encouraging supportive people to form teams, use the internet to recruit teammates willing to both walk and make a pledge, and generally spread the word about the importance of the effort and the need to raise much-needed research funds. That formula, while not exactly revolutionary, had proved to be extremely effective in support of Alzheimer's research. What might be unique, however, about the Walk To End Alzheimer's, is that not all the money raised goes to research. A considerable portion is devoted to providing local support services to both patients and, perhaps more importantly, to their caregivers.



It's no secret that Alzheimer's caregivers are, more often than not, family members who are so blessed with incalculable reserves of love and empathy for their suffering loved ones that they labor, often to the point of both mental and physical exhaustion, to ease the suffering and provide for every need of those living with this terrible scourge. It's also no secret that the importance of support for these caregivers cannot be overstated. This is where the Alzheimer's Association makes perhaps its greatest day-to-day impact. By helping the caregivers to cope, by assuring them that they are not alone, and by constantly reminding them that the value of their sacrifices cannot be measured, the Alzheimer's Association makes it possible for many of these selfless caregivers to simply carry on.

That first Walk To End Alzheimer's in 2018 raised almost \$85,000 for the organization. In 2019, they raised over \$118,000, and although the 2020 walk was virtual due to the pandemic, they still managed to raise almost \$90,000. In 2020, participants

This year, the event again will take place in Eagle on September 25th and it WILL NOT be virtual! Their goal is ambitious: to raise \$130,000. With the help of Traci and Mike Wodlinger and many other committed team leaders, that goal will surely be within reach.


What are your favorite books? If You Want to Be a Groovicorn.

Do they have animals? Camels, turtles, and some animals in Morocco are dolphins and goats. Goats climb trees to eat fruit.


And what do you want to do when you grow up? A singer or a vet.



This unique exhibit is designed to express awareness and compassion by telling the stories of actual survivors and highlighting the problem, scope, and organizations that are helping to abolish slavery in this generation.

Together, this dynamic husband and wife team, located here in Colorado, enlightened us as to the realities of global human trafficking and inspired us with the concept that one idea can take hold and truly make a difference. What began with one portrait eight years ago has evolved into a collection of 230 original oil paintings and will be on exhibit at Colorado Mountain College in Edwards in early 2022. ### Continuing the Conversation with

# BOB AND LIBBY....

Having enjoyed a lively night of conversation and celebration, the difficult topic of the fight against human trafficking raised a few follow up questions from our residents. Bob and Libby Swenson were happy to provide a response to many FAQ's...

What is the mission of Love Justice International ("LJI")? To fight against the world's greatest injustices.

What is the annual budget of LJI? \$4.8 million.

#### What differentiates LJI'S strategy against human trafficking? LJI

deploys a unique strategy referred to as Transit Monitoring. LJI trains and places monitors at strategic transit points (airports, bus stations, train stations, and country borders) to identify and stop trafficking as it is occurring - BEFORE people are exploited. These monitors are highly vigilant to any suspicious behavior.

In the event a thorough interview with the potential victim has given the monitor reason to determine it is, in fact, a trafficking situation, the monitors are quick to call upon the local authorities to intervene. To date, the organization has intercepted more than 24,900 individuals to prevent them from being trafficked.

#### What is the relationship between LJI and FREEDOM 58? Freedom

58 collaborates with several anti-trafficking organizations and began working with LJI in 2014, due to LJI's scalable strategy of Transit Monitoring. Freedom 58 raises awareness of the strategy and mission of LJI through art events, fundraising endeavors and speaking engagements.

What is the mission of Freedom 58? The mission of Freedom 58 is to guide and strengthen anti-trafficking organizations in the pursuit of justice. As a collaborative movement, Freedom 58 works diligently to raise awareness and help end modern-day slavery and violent oppression around the world.

#### What is the purpose of the FACES OF FREEDOM art exhibit? FACES OF

FREEDOM is an art exhibit that raises awareness about the realities and effects of human trafficking and other forms of violent oppression in the world today. By celebrating the survivors and highlighting their partner organizations who intercept and rescue, FACES OF FREEDOM presents opportunities for public and community leaders to engage.

What was the inspiration behind the FACES OF FREEDOM exhibit? When Bob Swenson discovered that 2 million children



are exploited in the global commercial sex slave trade each year, he began to ask himself some questions. "How deep does this horrific problem reach into our communities, schools, places of transit and tourism? How can the community respond to this injustice and violent oppression of the poor and vulnerable?"

Hence, the FACES OF FREEDOM art exhibit was created to change the conversation in communities by taking people on a justice journey through art to raise awareness of human trafficking and deepen their compassion for the poor and oppressed. Portraits are typically reserved for people of nobility around the world, and Freedom 58 wanted to convey dignity, honor and beauty to the most marginalized in the world through these paintings.


**How is Freedom 58 funded?** The project is funded through private donations from individuals, churches and the NFL Foundation.

**How is Freedom 58 staffed?** There are no paid staff members. Freedom 58 is comprised of volunteers, artists and Board members who are passionate about justice and ending modern-day slavery.

Where has the exhibit been shown? The exhibit has been displayed in universities, government facilities, hospitals, churches, First Friday art walks, rotary clubs, newspapers, television, and advertised on NPR local radio programs.

The FACES OF FREEDOM exhibit will be on display at Colorado Mountain College in Breckenridge from August – December 2021. It will then be moved to CMC in Edwards from January – July 2022. # A Visit with Raymond Bleesz

### at a Second Friday Eagle ARTwalk


Singletree fine art photographer, Raymond Bleesz, has been busy of recent. At a Second Friday Eagle ARTwalk, he displayed three of his images: "Believe On The Reservation", "Spirits & Faces" which was taken outside of Flagstaff on a fence line, and "Blue Bird On The Reservation". The imagery definitely offers stories and needed contemplation and is characteristic of the photographer's work ethos.

During the Exhibition, Raymond also delivered posits and demonstrations as to how early photographers used such a piece of equipment, i.e. his historic Scovill 6.5 x 8.5 Albion Field Camera (1880's) with its original Bausch & Lomb lens. This camera, a very rare beast due to its size and age, was acquired by Raymond at a local cattle rancher's auction several years ago and has since been undergoing a restoration project.

The local photographer enthusiastically offered "the curious and the inquisitive" an opportunity to "load" film into a 4x5 film holder. After a "customer" took an interest in doing so, Bleesz provided the basic instruction on how to handle and load 4x5 film into the film holder, which is normally done in a "dark room" on a workbench. Being outside, the "customer" either chose a bandana or closed one's eyes in making believe he or she was in the darkroom loading a film holder.

Following the instructor's demonstration, he guided guests through the following task:

Part One (eyes closed): Open the box of 4x5 film - with both hands requiring finger dexterity- and select a single piece of film. Close the box of film, insert the sheet of film into the film holder properly as alignment is necessary, close the flap, and then close the dark slide.

Part Two: Turn over the film holder on the workbench and repeat the above maneuvers as there are 2 sheets of film in a film holder. Typically, camera men out in the field would have numerous film holders in a kit.

Those who partook of this activity were pleasantly pleased with their amateur attempts and thoroughly enjoyed the experience.


