- In 2021, 86% of average snowpack translated into 36% of average inflow into Lake Powell
- We are experiencing the 22nd year of the most extreme drought in 1,200 years
- Due to increasing temperatures: low soil moisture + average snowpack = low stream flows

What we can do:

- Focus on reducing outdoor water use
- Sweep your deck rather than hose it down
- Water in short intervals to give time for water to soak into the soil
- Adjust irrigation clocks at least monthly based on water needs
- Adhere to the Water Use Regulations
- Use outdoor water as efficiently as possible
- Consider reducing irrigated landscape area
- Use native vegetation when landscaping
- If your water bill includes use in Tiers IV and V that is considered unsustainable!

Betsy and Mike were left facing the ultimate horror that parents have to face – the tragic loss of a child whose life had just begun. To compound the horror, Paul's passing was not the first death of a child they had had to face. Tragically, Paul's older sister, Nichole Sara Cuthbertson, passed away at 4 1/2, shortly after Paul was born. Nichole suffered for years with a degenerative brain disorder that caused frequent and devastating seizures. Nichole knew of Paul's impending birth and waited to meet him. After Paul was born, he



and Mike Cuthbertson, began a sixmile backcountry trek to the Polar Star Inn to attend a weekend get together with his co-workers at RA Nelson LLC, a longtime local general contractor. Paul was a competent and careful backcountry veteran and completely comfortable making the climb to the Polar Star, but he never made it to the hut.

n the early afternoon of May

18th, 2019, Paul Cuthbertson,

L the 21-year-old son of Betsy

When he failed to arrive, his co-workers set out looking for him early that Saturday morning and contacted Vail Mountain Rescue to report that Paul was missing. After an exhaustive search on skis and snowmobiles, Paul's body was found in a tree well, and his cause of death was determined to be exposure and hypothermia. Somehow along the way, he sustained injuries that included cerebral edema, a dislocated shoulder, a broken nose, and a series of contusions. He had made a

and Nichole would lie together, and his mere presence would calm her, and the seizures would briefly stop. Their time together was brief but beautiful. Paul lived his life always mindful of her.

In addition to his sister, Paul also experienced the loss of friends and family who passed before their time. In an effort to never forget those he knew who passed too soon, he created the motto "Live For Those Who Cannot." He never wavered from this commitment and, when he went off to college, had the motto tattooed on his forearm. In addition, Paul designed a Native American dream catcher bearing Nicole's initials and a dove in memory of his good friend and classmate who had also died before his time. He had this touching design tattooed over his heart. When Paul died, Betsy and Mike were again faced with the horrific loss of a child, but rather than curse the darkness, they chose to light a candle. Just months after his passing, they started the Paul Cuthbertson Foundation under the mantle that Paul had lived under all his life. They created The Live For **Those Who Cannot Scholarship** to help our community's youth who have deep ties to a Colorado mountain community. It prioritizes individuals ages 13-25 that can demonstrate a financial need, have a strong work ethic, are dedicated to mentoring other youth, and are deeply involved in their community. These scholarships range from \$500 to \$5000. It is the Foundation's intent to increase these scholarships as funding efforts continue.

The Foundation's website, **thepaulcuthbertsonfoundation.org**,

succinctly outlines its purpose and mission: "Since its inception in 2019, The Paul Cuthbertson Foundation has provided more than \$25,000 in cash scholarships to applicants who demonstrate intellectual curiosity, show fierce determination, and who exemplify Paul Cuthbertson's passion for the mountains. Grantees have included youth pursuing medical and nursing school, an aspiring Broadway actress, a ballerina, a videographer, a competitive mountain biker, a World Cup alpine ski



racer, and numerous other athletes pursuing outdoor winter snow sports."

One grateful winner expresses her sincere appreciation for being selected as a recipient of a Live For Those Who Cannot Scholarship. In her words,




Jami Nix Rahn:

creating art for social change

The first two years of this decade have made it clear that the problems of an individual nation on an individual continent are impossible to hide in this globally connected world of information and sharing of the human experience. In the last half-century, humanity has been hyper-focused on creating online spaces that share a collective consciousness as well as collective concerns.

What once was a world away now seems intrusive enough to spark outrage and compassion on a global scale as it is shared across the nations with the click of a button. The Nationalism of the last two centuries marches towards Globalism, and the ability to put aside our differences and recognize our collective humanity is the mark of a 21st-century citizen of the world. As such, the atrocities and suffering created with human trafficking that has existed in places such as India are actually problems we here can help ease and solve through awareness and action.

Bob and Libby Swenson have taken on the task of ending human trafficking in India with their non-profit Freedom 58 Project. Freedom 58 is a traveling art exhibit featuring portraits and stories of survivors of human trafficking that aim to bring awareness of the global horrors and work towards bringing in donations to support the organizations that fight these traffickers in their individual nations, including the USA. Most notably, Freedom 58 supports the

Jami and her husband, Tom, attended this event and admired the artwork, and understood the goal of using art to raise awareness of the real-world problem of human trafficking. "After hearing Bob and Libby Swenson speak at a reception in Edwards, I felt as an artist that I must contribute to this extraordinary project," says Jami. She's always been a rather unabashed supporter of the struggles of women through her artwork; this meeting seemed clandestine.

"I had a conversation with Bob, and I let him know I am an artist and interested in helping the organization. I said to him, 'I think you should do something other than beautiful portraits; maybe you should have something that's not so pretty. Something that brings up emotion," Jami recalls. As an abstract artist who is no stranger to transmitting big collective emotions onto her canvases and bronze sculptures, Jami was honored to be selected to create three paintings for the Faces of Freedom exhibition.

When an artist creates for Freedom 58, they are provided a story or a picture and asked to translate that onto canvas. In Jami's case, as an abstract artist painting in a style described as a modern take on Orphism and Cubism, she was given the freedom to research concepts and ideas for her Freedom 58 paintings. In the painting, GB Road, Jami depicts the most notorious brothel, Number 64, and the darkness that occurs above the glittery shops and machine factories that make up this part of Delhi.

"When I begin a painting, I feel that it is very important to research my subject thoroughly. I want to tell a story with as much truth and passion as possible. GB Road in Delhi is infamous as a red-light district, but deceivingly as you pass by the shops on the ground floor, you will see hardware stores and retail shops buzzing with activity. There are machine shops making drill bits and bread makers, and there are shops displaying beautiful materials and Saris of all colors. But look deeper, and you will find shadowed figures in shaded windows and narrow stairwells leading to hundreds of Kothas (brothels) that occupy the upper floors," Jami muses, her eyes on the painting.

Jami created two versions of Girl in Stiletto Heels for Freedom 58. Both versions of the painting are extremely heartbreaking for a mother. "Bob presented me with the story of young girls in stiletto heels, and as the mother of two girls myself, this story hit me all that much harder," she says. According to Bob's story, a volunteer who works for Love Justice International went undercover in a Delhi nightclub. She observed young girls, as young as 7, being paraded across the stage in short skirts and heels that were far too large for them. When she approached the women who had led the young girls to the stage, they were quickly hustled away.

Girl in Stiletto Heels I demonstrates Jami's abstract intentions that serve as the more realistic impression of a young girl walking in oversized heels. Girl in Stiletto Heels II depicts a young girl being lured into the adult world of trafficking. In the background, she leaves behind her childhood where children are

organization Love Justice International, where Libby Swenson is the Regional Director of Development.

There was a piece presented in this magazine in April 2021 that raised awareness of the Swensons' commitment and passion for ending human slavery in their lifetime. The article was followed by a well-attended event at a Singletree home in July, where celebrated local artist Jami Nix Rahn met the Swensons and became involved in creating art for the exhibit, Faces of Freedom: Voices Calling for an End to Modern Day Slavery.

running free, playing a game of parachute. The figures to the right depict the world that will soon steal her away to a world where women become machines run by traffickers that will imprison them for life. The stiletto shoe floating in the water is a reminder of the women that have come and gone.

It's very emotional, very trying, very impossible to understand that this is something that happens within our world. "When I was doing this one, in particular, I could barely hold my hand to the brush," says Jami. "It's definitely highly emotional to work on a piece like this, and it makes the work all that more important. Sometimes I feel a little pressure that I'm not doing well enough on it. I want people to really feel it, to feel the rage and injustice and sadness and despair, and I feel the burden of whether I can get that emotion across to viewers."



Jami has always been involved with supporting organizations that attempt to disband human trafficking, formerly while in Florida and now during her full-time residency here in Colorado. "Love Justice International across the world offers these little huts, little safe houses, like an underground railroad to freedom, to help intercept these girls and women before they are sucked into the world of slavery," Jami relays. "It costs about \$100 to run these houses every day, and if my art can raise awareness to donate to this organization, I know I am directly saving women, girls, and, yes, even boys from a short and terrible fate."


