



Kathy Mikolasy GIVES BACK WITH PASSION

Kathy Mikolasy arrived in the Vail Valley in 1996, bringing with her a love of horses and six years of experience in helping school-aged children with special needs deal with the challenges they face. As a volunteer in an equine therapy program in North Carolina, she was able to combine the two great passions in her life — horses and helping others — to discover a path that would define her life.

She moved to Edwards and was able to create a local equine therapy program at what was then the Ranch at Berry Creek, the present location of Battle Mountain High School. That program was aptly called Cowboy Dreams. She lived in a trailer on the ranch during the program's two years existence. Although Cowboy Dreams had a rather short run, the success it had with helping special needs kids cope with life told Kathy that it needed to continue somewhere.

During her time with Cowboy Dreams, Kathy was making the trek to Crested Butte every March, where she volunteered in a ski clinic sponsored by the VA hospital in Grand Junction and the DAV. That clinic focused on teaching the skills needed to teach skiing to disabled veterans. She was at that clinic in 2000 and broke her leg in a ski accident. As a result of that accident,

she was unable to teach riding at the ranch. As a result of not being able to teach riding, she was a "non-revenue producing" employee, and, as a result of being nonrevenue producing, she was kicked out of her trailer!

But, as the old expression goes, it's always darkest just before the dawn, and this point in Kathy's life illuminates this perfectly. Through a friend, Kara Heide, Kathy learned of a ranch that was owned by Gail and Carl Dietz in Eagle; as it turned out, they were looking for someone to run the ranch and teach riding as they were in the process of moving to Arizona part-time. Despite her being unable to walk, ride, or even drive at the time, she jumped at the opportunity and moved to the ranch. After all, a broken leg is temporary, but a love of horses and helping others is forever! The Dietzes were big supporters of Small Champions and encouraged Kathy's involvement. Their support included never charging Kathy a boarding fee for her "magic horses."

That was in 1998, and once she got back on her feet (literally, in this case), she continued her work with horses. In 2005, she started working with Small Champions, the local not-for-profit founded by Connie Miller and Kara Heide in 1996 that helps children with cognitive and developmental disabilities through winter and summer sports programs. Kathy was hired to develop an equine therapy program for the organization. But just to ensure that Kathy's logistical and employment challenges weren't over, the owner of the ranch in Eagle, where she was running the program for Small Champions, decided to sell the property in 2022, and the new owners told Kathy that she would have to take her three horses elsewhere. By this point, Kathy had moved to Singletree, so housing wasn't an issue, but she had nowhere to house her animals.

Fortunately, she found out about Calhoun Ranch in Lake Creek. They welcomed Kathy, her horses, and the Small Champions program she had created, and she was able to continue without missing nary a beat.


Kathy's commitment to helping challenged children is not limited to working with horses, however. She has also been volunteering with Special Olympics since 1996.





Special Olympics and Small Champions work closely with each other to provide a seamless transition for the kids who age out of Small Champions. When that day comes, Special Olympics is ready to welcome them with sports-oriented programs designed to continue their therapy. Special Olympics offers skiing, swimming, golf, bowling, horse therapy, and bocce training and competition to Eagle County's physically and developmentally challenged youth and adults alike, as the program has no upper age limit. Kathy volunteers for Special Olympics as a ski and equine therapy coach. When June arrives each year, Kathy continues to give back by heading east to Atlanta, where she serves as a counselor at Camp Sunshine, a camp for children with cancer. She does this to honor her parents, who both passed away from cancer.

Kathy Mikolasy has been able to combine her skills and her commitment to giving back and, as a result, has added another dimension to what makes our community and the Vail Valley so welcoming. No matter your limitations, either physical or emotional, you will be able to find a program and a mentor designed to help make your life full and rewarding.





Carrie shares that "Mae has been the silver lining of COVID-19 for our family. During stay-at-home orders in the spring of 2020, we joined my sister, Mary Cotton, and her family for daily walks. Since it was our only social interaction during that time, we never missed a day of walking, even during rain, sleet, and snow." Carrie has never returned to her daily gym habit (except for tennis!) and continues to walk Mae for 3 to 5 miles every day in Singletree. Getting out of the gym and outside has been great for her mental health and also serves as a way to see Singletree neighbors and for Mae to have her social interaction with other dogs in the neighborhood.

Adjusting to an empty house has been difficult for a COVID-19 puppy who thought normal life was the entire family engaged at home via Zoom for either school or work. While Mae has finally adjusted to being by herself during the day, there is nothing better than Mae hugs when we return home.

TOM BOYD

CARRIES ON A FAMILY LEGACY IN THE VAIL VALLEY:

Creating And Preserving Our Mountain Lifestyle

Most of us who have been in this valley for more than a year or two are well aware of the names of the people who made Vail happen in the early- to mid-'60s. Names like Seibert, Eaton, Frampton, Slifer, and Gramshammer have become synonymous with the early years of our valley and the contributions they made to put Vail on the map as one of the premier year-round vacation spots in the world.

But there is one name you may not know. A name that was present almost from day one and also made an indelible contribution to this valley. That name is Boyd.

In 1963, Steve Boyd, known as Louie, was a patroller at Aspen Highlands and was recruited to come to Vail and join our ski patrol. At the time, the village was a true fledgling. The streets were unpaved, the services were minimal, all housing was pretty much under construction, and guest facilities were spartan at best. The Red Lion was about it for food and drink, and the Lodge at Vail provided most of the visitor beds.

Steve brought with him, in addition to his patrolling skills, construction experience and a strong desire to be part of something new and exciting. He met his wife, Susan, in Denver, and soon afterward, the Boyds had three children: Steve Jr., Caitlin, and Tom. Louie passed away in 2018. Susan is known throughout the valley for her decades of work at the Vail Public Library, where she served as director for many years before retiring in the 2000s. She now lives in Eagle with her son Steve. Her daughter, Caitlin, lives in Edwards.

Their third child, Tom, lives in Singletree with his wife, Renee, and two children, Alex (8) and Tyler (10). Tom currently serves as the director of PR and communications for the Vail Valley Foundation, but the arc of his life embodies the growth of

the valley and represents the commitment of so many of our residents to give back to the community that has given so much to enrich our lives.

Tom was born in 1975. At the time, Vail Health was in a fairly primitive state and nowhere near the comprehensive, modern facility it is today. As a result, all three Boyd children were born at Rose Medical Center in Denver. Then it was back to Vail to continue building our community. Tom graduated from the Vail Mountain School in 1993 and went on to the University of Colorado to earn a degree in philosophy. After graduation, he went to work for *The Vail Trail* serving as a writer and editor, eventually serving as managing editor from 2003 to 2005.

Tom overlapped his time at *The Vail Trail* with freelance work for various ski magazines, as well as the Rocky Mountain News until its demise in 2009. In 2010 he picked up a pen for *The Denver Post*, focusing primarily on outdoor sports, but dabbling in other subjects as well. Journalism, however, wasn't his only interest. He brought his outdoor mountain roots as well as his writing skills to the world of international sports media.

Tom began this phase of his life in 2006, serving as the venue media chief at the Biathlon venue at the Torino, Italy, Olympic Winter Games, followed by the 2010 Vancouver Olympic Winter Games, the 2012 Innsbruck Youth Olympic Games, and the 2014 Nanjing Youth Olympic Games in China. During this time, he also co-founded a solar nonprofit called Nokero, which provided solar power options to underserved communities

worldwide. Tom led a media campaign that brought the company significant accolades in the international press.

Tom's media experience brought him to the attention of the Vail Valley Foundation (VVF) and his days on the road to a welcome end. In 2015, the VVF hired him to handle media and public relations for the organization.

The VVF has a sparkling international reputation for the work they have done in enhancing the overall quality of life in Eagle County. The nonprofit organization has a focus on arts, athletics, and education. This includes operating the Gerald R. Ford Amphitheater (where Tom was director from 2019 to 2021) and the Vilar Performing Arts Center, hosting the Vail Dance Festival each year,

and hosting athletic events like the GoPro Mountain Games and Xfinity Birds of Prey Audi FIS Ski World Cup. The organization also has a tremendous positive impact on local youth and families through its education nonprofit, YouthPower365, which supports youth and families "every step of the way" from early childhood to college and career readiness.

Tom Boyd's career path has placed him at the very core of who we are as a community: active, adventurous, fun-loving, competitive, and especially committed to giving back to both preserve and enhance the lifestyle we so covet. Along with his work at the Vail Valley Foundation, he was recently named Mountain Recreation's Volunteer of the Year for leading the annual effort to build the community outdoor skating rink

in Edwards. He also coaches youth hockey, is vice president of the board of directors for the Eagle River Watershed Council, and chairman of the board of directors for Community Builders.

Since 1964, the Boyd name has been interwoven into the fabric of the Vail Valley. Louie and Susan were here from the beginning and cultivated the Boyd family tradition of both promoting and building our community. Their family name clearly belongs among those who have steadfastly helped make this valley the wonderful home and destination it is today.

We all know about the history and good works done by the Special Olympics over the years, but to really appreciate what that organization has accomplished and stands for, you've got to bring things a lot closer to home. Fortunately, I had the opportunity to do just that when I sat down with three Special Olympians, their parents, and one of the volunteer coaches recently at the Eagle River Presbyterian Church in Avon.

Sara Haeffner and her parents, Karen and Jim; Jeff Douglas and his parents, Deb and Drex; and Jade Ohde and her mom, Andie, all have years of association with Special Olympics, the parents as supporters and the kids as participants, although calling them "kids" is not really accurate as Sara is 47, Jeff is 36, and Jade is 29.

These three Singletree families, as well as countless others throughout the valley, have benefited from the hard work of the dedicated team of volunteers that make up the staff of Special Olympics in Eagle County. One of those volunteer coaches, Kathy Mikolasy, whose wonderful story is told in another piece in this edition of *Stroll Singletree*, was also at our meeting.

We are familiar with the Paralympic Games that take place every four years in conjunction with the Olympic Summer and Winter Games, when the world's finest athletes with disabilities take center stage to compete for a spot on the Olympic podium, and we are regaled with media coverage about the challenges they had to overcome to reach that podium. But for every one of those stars, there are literally thousands of disabled athletes throughout the world that might not be as fast, strong, or agile as a Paralympic medalist, but they are every bit as hardworking and dedicated as the winners that grace our TV screens and newspapers.

Our three Special Olympians are not only dedicated and hardworking, but they are also multisport athletes who relish every competition and training session in which they participate. You can see it in their faces and hear it in their words when asked about the program and what it means to them. In the Vail Valley, our Special Olympians compete in four sports on teams that have names as unique as the teams themselves: The Wolf Pack Team competes on bicycles, recumbent bikes, or trikes, depending on the rider's needs; the Barracudas are the swim team; the Vail Valley Dream Team are the skiers; and the Back Bowlers are, well, the bowlers. Most of our local Special Olympians compete in more than one team so they can enjoy the program regardless of the season. In addition to those four named teams, the Special Olympics also offers bocce as a sport.

Each of our three Special Olympians has a favorite sport despite the fact that each of them participates in more than one. Jade Ohde prefers swimming because, as she said with a face-splitting grin, "I'm good at it!" and Sara said that she prefers to compete with the Back Bowlers and the Vail Valley Dream Team. Jeff Douglas leans toward skiing not only for the competition but because he is called upon to assist with setting up the course and facilities at Copper Mountain each winter when the State Special Olympic championships are held there. Armed with a radio and his everpresent rolls of duct tape, Jeff plays a pivotal role in making sure the course is both challenging and safe for the athletes. Today, Jeff is a true big

mountain skier capable of conquering the toughest terrain regardless of the conditions.

Jade has raced in many Colorado Special Olympics competitions, but a number of years ago, she participated in another role as well; she was a part of the torch parade ski-down at Copper Mountain. Normally that would have been a fun time for everyone, but that evening the weather was bitter cold and windy, and Jade allowed as how she had had more fun. She summed it up nicely when asked how it went for her. Her infectious grin reappeared, and she simply said, "Holy crap!" Well said, Jade.

Sara Haeffner started skiing at age 2 when she and her family lived in Birmingham, MI. Her father, Jim, an experienced ski instructor, taught her at a small local hill by first setting up just two gates. She mastered that, and Jim soon started adding gates until she was threading her way down the entire slope. She brought those skills and her passion for the sport with her when the family moved to Singletree 16 years ago.

All three of these Special Olympians have become accomplished skiers thanks to the dedicated group of volunteer coaches that have worked with them over the years. This skill, as well as their genuine passion, means they are truly a part of the fabric of this community. They can ski with their friends and their families and participate in the very activity that defines the Vail Valley.

In addition to their year-round participation in Special Olympics, Sara, Jeff, and Jade all hold down jobs in the valley. Sara works at the Avon City Market, Jeff is at Home Depot, and Jade Works at Route 6, The Community Market, and helps care for Gertrude, who lives in Singletree and is in her 90s! All three of these extraordinary athletes are there for every shift, and they are always on time.

But I would be remiss if I didn't mention what the Special Olympics does for the parents of these participants. They see it in their children's eyes, hearts, and attitudes what the program means for their kids, and it gives the parents some valuable free time as well as the chance to share experiences with other parents of children facing developmental and emotional challenges.

I think it's fitting that I close not with my words but with the words of Deb Douglas, Jeff's mom. "We are beyond grateful for the organization, and especially our coaches and volunteers who commit week after week and year after year to train, put on events, and support the athletes. They go above and beyond to make everyone feel included and successful in their endeavors. A huge and deep thank you to all of the coaches and the organization."
