# Radiance and Relaxation Found at Natural Balance Spa

Born and raised in the valley, Jessica Johnson has a long family history in the Eagle Valley. Her grandfather's family homesteaded in Gypsum, and her grandmother was born and raised in the valley. "I love our small mountain community," says Jessica. "I feel very lucky to call it home." Here, she shares with us her experience, knowledge, and inspiration behind opening Natural Balance Spa.

When did you open Natural Balance Spa? I opened my spa on June 29, 2022.

What were you doing before you opened your own spa? Before opening Natural Balance Spa, I worked at the Sonnenalp Hotel Spa in Vail for almost 19 years as the lead esthetician. I had previously worked in Florida for a short time at a day spa as well as in Waikiki, Hawaii, at the Moana Surfrider Moana Lani Spa.

What inspired you to start your own business? First, I wanted more connection with my clients to help them with their skin concerns. I have a passion for skin care and helping people look and feel their best. I loved working at the Sonnenalp but seeing clients only once a year when they were on vacation was no longer what I wanted. I want to make a difference in my clients' skin by helping them achieve their skin care goals. Secondly, I have a 5-year-old son, and I was spending way too much time in the car driving from Gypsum to Vail to work







every day. I wanted to work closer to home and to be able to have more time with my husband and my son. He is our only child, so I need as much time as I can with him.

# How do you differentiate Natural Balance Spa from spas in the valley?

I have 20 years of experience as an Esthetician, so I have seen a lot of skin. I am very passionate about helping people and making them feel good. I work very closely with all my clients and take the time to come up with an individual plan to help them achieve their skin care goals.

I use amazing products at my spa. Ultraceuticals is a medical-grade, cosmeceutical product line out of Australia. When choosing a line, I want a clean, result-driven line. I knew cosmeceutical was the route I wanted to go, but a lot of U.S. cosmeceutical brands have so much "junk" in their products. Ultraceuticals is made in Australia, which has a high standard of what they can and cannot put into their products. I also carry ANDA — an all-organic skin care line. It provides wonderful results for hydrating dry, dull skin.

Can you please describe the scope of services you offer? I offer a wide

variety of facial options. My signature treatment is Facial Soundscapes. It uses tuning forks as sound vibrations, which help to relax and ground the body, opening up meridian lines to help improve your skin issues. What would you like to share with us about your family? Family means everything to me. I come from a huge extended family where my cousins are like my siblings. I cherish every minute I have with them. I have a wonderful husband, Brad, who I married 12 years ago. We have one son, Jake, who is 5

years old. He keeps us very busy, and I love every minute of it. We spend most of the summer camping, riding dirt bikes, fishing, and rafting, and our winters are full of family ski days.

What are your favorite interests and activities? I grew up riding dirt bikes and still love them. I enjoy traveling and visiting new places. I love my family and enjoy spending time with them. I also love to learn what is up in coming in my profession. I enjoy attending the many skin care conferences throughout the year; there's always so much to learn.

# What education or training did you need to start your new business?

I received my trainer certification from Animal Behavior College in December 2020, then mentored with various trainers in the valley before opening my Waggin' Tails.

How do you differentiate Waggin'
Tails from other dog obedience
programs? I focus heavily on building
a relationship with your dog through
consistency, communication, and
positive reinforcement, as well as
learning your dog's body language and
what makes them unique.

# Can you please describe the scope of services you offer for dogs? I

offer semi-private group classes as well as customized, one-on-one sessions. I also offer doggy daycare and overnight boarding for puppies and dogs that fit my criteria.

When is the "right" time to start training with your dog? Starting the training and bonding process from the moment your new puppy or adopted dog comes into your life is extremely important. Setting boundaries, creating consistency and a schedule, and limiting their freedom in your house are great ways to help set them up for success rather than failure. Once a bond has been created, then "official" training sessions can begin.

#### What is the most challenging thing you have encountered so far in owning Waggin' Tails Dog Obedience?

So far, the most challenging thing has been the occasional lack of owner compliance. Consistency and repetition require time and dedication in order to accomplish the behaviors that most people want from their dogs. Without that, it's unfair to expect





things from your dog that they just haven't learned yet.

What is the most rewarding part of your role as the owner of Waggin' Tails? The most rewarding part is witnessing puppies/dogs connecting with their owners and becoming a team based on mutual respect, patience, and a willingness to accept each other for who they are and what their needs may be at any given time.

What is one of your favorite
"success stories"? A lovely lady
came in with her young Havanese
puppy, who had been biting both
her and her daughters. Not play
biting, real biting! This little guy
had decided HE was the boss of the
house, and everyone was below
him on the leadership ladder. But
with a big change in Mom's attitude
and energy and some clear, nonnegotiable boundaries being laid
down, the little guy is now the
biggest snuggle bunny ever!

What is one piece of advice you would offer to our readers today? Raising dogs is very similar to raising children. Both need clear, unbendable, non-negotiable boundaries and structure. Without this, they are left to make their own choices about things, which usually ends up being the wrong decision. Honor your dog for who they are at any given moment on any given day, and don't place unreasonable expectations on them. If you haven't taught them, they don't know what you want. And teaching them takes LOTS of time, practice, consistency, and patience ... just like kids!

# MY FUTURE PATHWAYS: HELPING TO MAKE SUCCESS MORE ACCESSIBLE

Perhaps Nelson Mandela summed it up best in 2003 when he said, "Education is the most powerful weapon you can use to change the world." He was certainly right, but sadly and for many reasons, from culture to economics and basic opportunity, the benefits of a complete education are often beyond the reach of those who need it the most.

I recently had the opportunity to sit down with two of the important cogs in the wheel that is My
Future Pathways (MFP), a local organization dedicated to improving access to higher education for local kids: Wendy Rudolph, a board member and Singletree resident, and Bratzo Horruitiner, the executive director. They provided me with a detailed and fascinating story about the organization and its goals, as well as its record of success. First, however, a bit of history.

In 2007, Ron Davis founded Guardian Scholars, an organization dedicated to providing a college education to first-generation kids in the valley. By first-generation, Ron meant the first generation in a family to attend and graduate from college. The mission of Guardian Scholars was to provide college scholarships to these first-generation kids to attend and, most importantly, graduate from college. Guardian Scholars provided not

only scholarships but also support for these kids to ensure that they stick with the program by helping them cope when things got tough. In the beginning, Guardian Scholars worked with Colorado Mesa College in Grand Junction to provide the opportunity to these kids who came primarily from the Latino community in Eagle County.

The program was working well, but Ron and the staff soon realized that, for some reason, the vast majority of the participants in the program were girls. The question they asked was why and what they could do to increase participation by the boys. What they discovered, after some careful stocktaking, was that a shocking 48% of the boys enrolled in Eagle County schools never graduated. 48%! In addition, of the few boys who did finish high school and go on to college, only 11% saw the experience through to graduation.

They determined that the primary reasons for this disparity were both cultural and economic. Within their community, Latino boys were expected to help with family finances by working. This pressure proved to be the reason so few boys were participating, as full-time work and full-time

education are rarely compatible. Girls, on the other hand, seemed to be better prepared for college. They matured earlier and studied harder, as the demands on them to work were considerably diminished. This gave them the opportunity to focus their energies more on education and emotional development.

In 2018, the leadership of Guardian Scholars realized that work needed to be done to prepare boys for higher education, so they created My Future Pathways. Ron Davis continued as board chair, and Bratzo became the executive director. MFP adopted a three-pillar approach: 1) socialemotional support to develop selfesteem, resiliency and critical thinking; 2) academic support, including mentoring and tutoring programs to promote academic excellence; and 3) a focus on wellness as a way to increase self-worth and instill values. They worked not only with the students but also with their parents. They realized that not everyone is suited to attend a four-year college and began providing scholarships to Colorado Mountain College and Western Colorado Community College, a trade

school with 30 associate degree and certification programs ranging from agricultural science to wildland fire management, with ongoing support to students attending those institutions. And MFP began working with local employers to provide students with opportunities to work in the Vail Valley.

Today, My Future Pathways programs are embedded throughout the Eagle County school system. They operate in three middle schools and two high schools as well as provide two safe spaces outside the schools for kids to learn and socialize, one in Edwards and the other in Gypsum. They provide academic support through in-person tutoring as well as emotional support from trained professionals and peer assistance from past participants in the program. Their results are truly astounding.

Now more than 90% of the kids participating in the program graduate from one of the three institutions that MFP works with, and, perhaps more importantly, they graduate debt-free. This success, however, does not come without some hard work. After the kids graduate from high school and go on to







higher education, their grades are constantly monitored to ensure that the high academic standards MFP demands are being met. The result of this effort is that the average GPA for MFP kids is 3.1. And to ensure that everyone graduates debt-free, each student is required to complete a financial literacy program.

When Wendy and her husband, Graeme Bush, moved to Singletree from Washington, D.C., they brought with them a strong desire to give back and an interest in education. Wendy was drawn to My Future Pathways as an excellent vehicle for addressing both her passions, and she has not been disappointed in her decision

to help. The enthusiasm and commitment both she and Bratzo have for MFP's mission becomes evident from the moment you sit down with them. My Future Pathways is but another example of the efforts that are being made in Eagle County to make sure that opportunity and assistance are available to everyone, with a capital "E." If Wendy and Bratzo's involvement is any indicator, My Future Pathways is in good hands indeed.
















# Treasure Hunting at Remix Consignment



Note from Holly: Of course, Stella! We would love to see you at a Singletree doggie event this summer!





After graduating high school, I attended Hope College in Holland, MI. I went in undeclared but soon chose English literature as my major, as I had always valued and enjoyed reading and writing. I continued to dance in the college's dance company, became involved in student life traditions, and worked as a campus tour guide. Being in a liberal arts school, I was required to take a language. I remember thinking, "Why not try French?" After I fulfilled my general education requirements, I continued with French, merely enjoying the discipline and beauty of studying a language. I was soon studying abroad in Paris and on track for a double major

in French and English literature and a minor in art history.

I am so grateful for my time in college; I matured in relationships, learned to be confident in my abilities, and gained a broader worldview. I was very engaged in my classes, spending time in the professor's office hours, gleaning from the wisdom of studied men and women. I continue to love and value the depth brought from taking the time to study how people think and express their views of the world.

With these newfound values and curiosities, I graduated in the spring

of 2021, excited about the openness of where my life could go while also overwhelmed by that breadth of opportunity. Having worked as a horse wrangler in the summers between college, I wanted my next step to be working on a dude ranch. I thought it would be a great break from studying









and knew I had always valued physical work. For the next five months, I worked at Wind River Ranch, a Christian dude ranch in Estes Park. It was a time of great flourishing in the midst of trials as I was confronted with fears and insecurities that I had been living into and holding onto, things that can only be dispelled with a surrendered and humble heart before the Lord. The long days, exhaustion, and difficult situations were balanced with serving guests, true

friends, and horsemanship. I am not sure where all my passions and interests will coincide in the future (or if they will coincide at all), but as I worked at this ranch, my values were further narrowed down, as I now know I love serving others and doing hard outdoor work.

I am now in Paris, France, for at least eight months, teaching English in primary schools and working with refugees. It has been a literal leap of faith and trust as I have had to, in every sense, move; I started a new job, opened a bank account, found housing, and met new friends, all in a different language. I so value the discomfort (and try to remember that I value it in the midst), knowing that uncertainties and trials are both where we learn our values and where we choose to grow.

Growing up in Singletree and the Vail Valley was a blessing that I did not know I had until I left: the ability to be active and healthy, access to the wilderness, also access to amazing arts such as the Vail Dance Festival, a supportive community ... it is something that, as a multifaceted person, is a dream come true. At the same time, I am grateful for the opportunities I have had to expand my worldview, to interact and live with people very different from me, then to humbly bring these experiences back to my home. I am not sure where I will end up (even in the next year), but I know that I will always consider the valley home.



Some of my earliest and fondest memories of childhood revolved around Singletree: tennis lessons at the Sonnenalp, many walks to the park, holiday parties at neighbor's houses, and taking our dog hiking on







the June Creek trail (which we dubbed the "Kipper hike"). My siblings and I were so lucky to have parents who instilled in us a love of our neighbors and community, and we were doubly blessed to have Singletree be our wonderful community. Our little "backyard" gang of four families and their kids was really an extended family, some of whom have remained in our lives for the biggest milestones: graduation, marriage, loss, celebration, and everyday life in between. This neighborhood has not just given me a place for sweet memories to be held but also a solid ground from which I have been able to confidently step into the next stages of life.

After graduating from Vail Christian High School in 2017, I got my Bachelor of Music in ethnomusicology and voice performance at Wheaton College. I spent four years in the Chicago area during the school year and then spent my summers in Spain and Italy experiencing music in a truly multi-faceted way. I finished my tenure at Wheaton with a songwriting internship with a racial reconciliation ministry in Richmond, Virginia. This time actually turned me back to the world of Western Classical music, and I decided to spend a year working while I applied to grad school.

I had the chance to be a producer on Vail Valley Live alongside other wonderful Singletree residents, Tricia Swenson and Rachel Ledon. It was an incredible year of learning from the best in the media and broadcast business, and it reminded me how lucky I am to call this place home.

While I was working in the Valley and traveling to audition at schools, I was able to continue to make happy memories in Singletree, my favorite being our "Kipper hike" with my mom.

After many rounds of auditions and essays, I was offered a graduate assistantship at Missouri State University's music school and am now pursuing a Master of Music studying classical voice as well as teaching voice classes, voice lessons, and assisting in the opera. It is such a joy to be back in an academic environment for music!

I love studying this craft and am deeply passionate about making it accessible to younger audiences and audiences that might not have a chance to see a symphony concert or an opera. The classical music tradition has an extremely rich and diverse history, and it is so cool to see the different ways it touches people. I love being able to hone my craft and become the best singer I can be, and I hope that I will be able to bring beauty through music to whatever community I go to next.

I am hoping to take what I am learning and bring more music to communities like the Vail Valley. I am deeply grateful to Bravo! Vail and many other musicians in the Valley for their passion for giving us these experiences and opportunities, and I hope that I can bring the same enhanced experiences to our community or another one like it.


