
WHERE TO TURN WHEN A CAREGIVER NEEDS CARE

It is so wonderful to see so many young families here but many of us are over 65 and want to age healthily in our beautiful neighborhood. So, imagine that a loved one has just been diagnosed with Alzheimer's or another form of dementia, Parkinson's, a traumatic brain injury, or had a stroke and in order for them to remain at home, you are now a caregiver. More than one in five Americans provide unpaid care for a loved one without training, support or financial assistance. For most, this is a very stressful and isolating experience. That's where Caregiver Connections comes in.

Being a caregiver can be overwhelming and people often don't know where to turn for help. We begin every relationship with a one-on-one Care Consultation with one of our Aging Life Care Professionals to help answer personal questions, find solutions and connect families to appropriate resources and support. Our Dementia Caregiver Support Group is offered twice a month to help caregivers navigate the special needs of this devastating disease. We also offer a Parkinson's Caregiver Support Group twice a month. For those in need of durable medical equipment, our Medical Equipment Closet allows people to borrow such items as wheelchairs, walkers and shower benches.

RESPITE

Higher levels of stress, anxiety and depression are common among family caregivers of older adults and it becomes essential that they get a break, known as respite. However, in many situations, their loved one cannot be left alone. The Senior Spot Adult Day Program is offered every Monday and Wednesday from 12:00 - 3:00 PM at the Golden Eagle Senior Center. It is designed to provide socialization for a loved one through shared meals, gentle exercise, reminiscing, and music while giving caregivers a break. An Activity Buddy volunteer can also be requested to spend time with loved ones and engage in an agreed-upon activity for up to three hours at a time. The relationships formed in this program are so rewarding and sometimes last for years.

I learned about Caregiver Connections as a result of my work as chair of the Rocky Mountain Walk to End Alzheimer's. I am so impressed with the dedication and compassion of everyone involved in Caregiver Connections and am thrilled to now be their Director of Development.

They are one of the only local organizations to provide these types of services and support to Eagle County residents. Many of our services are offered free of charge with donations encouraged. We are fortunate for our many donors who make this possible. We are so grateful for our volunteers and are always looking for people to help out with our programs or become an Activity Buddy.

UP IN LIGHTS!

The work of Raymond Bleesz graces the iconic Daniels & Fisher clocktower

Throughout the month of March, the work of Raymond A. Bleesz was digitally projected upon the historic Daniels & Fisher tower in downtown Denver as part of a collection of images from a total of 60 photographers. Raymond's image entitled Joe Berry

Christian Cowboy, Prague, Ok 1987 was cast upon the side of the building for periods of 12 seconds continuously rotating from 6:00 p.m. to midnight every night. As a citywide effort initiated in 2009 to promote fine art photography, the *Month of Photography (MoP)* festival in Denver is Colorado's largest photographic event.

Additionally, Raymond's work was accepted for *The Big Picture* Colorado exhibition. The founder of MoP and the creator of The Big Picture Colorado, Mark Sink of the Sink Gallery, selected two of Raymond's images to be digitally enlarged to be "wheat-pasted" on the sides of commercial buildings in downtown Denver during MoP. The first photo for wheat pasting is entitled Hopi McDonalds, a McDonald's fast-food logo at a traffic stop light in the Native American Reservation in Arizona, a biting satire of our society. Ironically and perhaps attesting to the artistic importance of the image, Sink also selected Joe Berry, Christian Cowboy, Prague, Ok, 1987 as the second image for the open-air project.

Two of the photographer's images intended to evoke the "Essence of Colorado" were also accepted for the MoP Capturing Colorado exhibit at the Denver Four Mile High Historic Park: a portrait of Eagle County Rancher, Ben Wurthsmith, long time rancher, recently deceased, as well as a downtown scenic landscaping view of Historic Georgetown, the Silver Queen of the West.

In conjunction with these events, Raymond has compiled 20 BW photos, 8.5 x 11 sized images for perusal, browsing or contemplation. 

A Cruise Through Viking Homelands

In August and September, Dave and I took a twice-delayed trip to Scandinavia. We had been to several places in Sweden and Denmark on two prior trips and always thought we would like to do an ocean cruise that included Norwegian fjords. Viking Cruises, based in Bergen, Norway, offered an itinerary called Viking Homelands that sounded ideal - visits to several old favorites plus many new places to explore. We decided to add on a four-day pre-trip to Norway's main cities of Oslo and Bergen, linked by a train ride across the central spine of low mountains. I then added a post-trip stay in Stockholm on our own.

Late summer is an ideal time to visit Scandinavia due to the stilllong days and warm temperatures without the mosquitos of early summer. One caveat, however, these are rainy countries, especially Norway. We flew into Oslo on a typical rainy day where we were whisked to our beautiful downtown hotel. Oslo is both extremely modern and romantically old-world with gleaming new apartments, museums, and the famous opera house on the waterfront within walking distance of cobblestone streets, royal palaces, a still-working medieval fortress, and restaurants galore. A bit farther afield are Viking history and nautical museums, and the Holmenkollen Olympic ski jump.

After two days, we took a scenic rail trip across the country to Bergen. The scenery is wild, high tundra with mountain peaks and lakes as far as the eye can see. We passed many hiker's hotels and hostels along the way. The center of Norway is relatively uninhabited, with only five percent of the country's land mass arable. Most people live in the major cities on the coast which serve as government and cultural centers and on the west coast as the base for both fishing and the North Sea oil industry.


Bergen is a stunning harbor city with its origins as one of the Hanseatic League trading cities. It was fabulously wealthy in the 1600s and the wellpreserved old town of Bryggen on the harbor is a must-see. Two days in a downtown hotel were barely enough





to explore the old and new parts of the city, a living folk museum, and a tranquil park with lakes and hiking trails just a funicular ride above the city. It was now time to embark on our two-week cruise. First up were the wildly-anticipated fjords. Dave and I spent a morning kayaking the Eidfjord, where the two-thousand-foot-high forested walls dropped immediately to a two-thousand-foot depth. Norwegians love their country cabins and their boats, and most places we went, whether city or country, we passed the charming little red cabins and houses with smiling locals sailing by.

Our next port was Stavanger, the home of the oil industry, as well as a centuries-old fishing port. Until oil was discovered in the 1960's, Norway was a poor country with little ability to farm or provide food other than fish. It is now one of the wealthiest countries in Europe, with the oil profits



funding a strong network of social services, and the Sovereign Wealth Fund stockpiling investments against the day when the oil runs out. The city has a colorful old town of painted wooden houses and a terrific oil museum.

Time to leave Norway and off to Denmark. The ship stopped at Aalborg in the far north, an ancient trading port dating from the time of the Vikings, and now known for its beautiful medieval merchant center and modern University and Opera House. Copenhagen was next. It is impossible to see as much as you would like on a cruise ship stop, but fortunately we had been there twice before. The inner harbor is a classic stop with colorful bars and restaurants lining a tiny harbor. I recommend a separate visit to this fabulous city to see all the royal palaces, design stores, and vibrant culture.

Our next stop was a train ride to Berlin from the north German port of Warnemunde. We took in all the must-see sights, including the Reichstag, Brandenburg Gate, and the Berlin Wall Memorial. My father's aunts, uncles and cousins were stuck behind the Iron Curtain in the Harz Mountains area of the old East Germany so it was a meaningful visit for me.

From there we went on to Gdansk, Poland, the site of the Lech Walesa-led Solidarity shipyard protests which resulted in the fall of the Communist government. In addition to its recent historical significance, it is also a beautiful medieval trading city known for crystal and amber with a compact walkable center.

On to Mariehamn, in the autonomous region of Aland, islands which are intriguingly part of both Sweden and Finland. Reachable by short ferries from both countries, it is a very popular summer tourist area and extremely quaint.











Our last stop was Stockholm. But first, the ship spent a full day cruising the stunningly beautiful archipelago. It appears the Swedes love their island country homes and sailboats just as much as the Norwegians. Stockholm is another northern European capital city well worth an extended visit. Prosperous, modern, clean and friendly, it is situated on hundreds of islands with an old town (Gamla Stan), a vast royal palace, many large parks and museums, and fantastic dining and shopping. We easily spent three days exploring areas we had not seen on our previous visit.

So, if it sounds like we really enjoyed Scandinavia, yes, we did. Where else can you get Vikings, medieval merchant towns, kayaking and sailing, modern design, vibrant cities, fantastic food, and history lessons both old and new?


