aullette MacDougal has been immersed in the performing arts both as an amateur and a professional since the ripe old age of three when she first sang in public. You read that right, she performed solos in church at three! It might be a bit of a stretch to say that at that tender age Paullette knew that she would pursue a career in the performing arts, but that's the way life unfolded for her, so let's just say she "never looked back".

During high school and college, she continued singing, joining a big band and touring with them throughout her home state of Wisconsin. In 1960, she earned an honors degree from the University of Wisconsin in vocal performance. Later, life took her twice to New Jersey where she acted and directed in community theatre.

She joined a performing group that raised money for organizations as diverse as the American Red Cross and survivors of Hurricane Opal which devastated the Gulf Coast of Florida in 1995. One of those survivors was her aging mother, so that effort became personal for Paullette.

In addition to singing, Paullette's ambition extended to writing fiction. She had tried to pursue this facet of the arts while in grade school, but rarely did she score above a C on her stories. It was not because she lacked the skills to get A's, but because her sense of originality required her to write what her active imagination told her, rather than stick to the assignment's stringency. For example, when her school reopened in the fall of 7th grade, the assignment was to write about the terminally boring, yet predictable

subject, "What did you do on your summer vacation?" Yawn! Well, Paullette's family was not wealthy enough to take vacations. While not totally ignoring the assignment, she got a bit fanciful. She wrote about a trip she took, not to Wisconsin Dells, not even close. She wrote a Sci-Fi: her trip to the Moon where she engaged in a fierce and bloody battle with a lunar dinosaur! The result was another C, while her classmate got an A for the paper titled "I Played With My Dog". So much for the imagination of teachers in the 1950's!

She garnered another poor grade for her first-person story in the voice of a middle-aged male reporter touring the *Pere La Chaise Cemetery* in Paris after WWII in search of a friend's grave. This teacher simply did not believe that an adolescent girl could write a story like that. Someone else must have. Maybe the definition of creative writing was different then.

The lack of academic appreciation for her literary talents inevitably led her back to singing. In 1958 she was cast as Laurey, the female lead in her university's production of Oscar Hammerstein II's classic work, *Oklahoma*. It was her first experience being in a stage play.

After Paullette wed her husband, Frank, in 1960, they lived in Minneapolis where she taught voice and piano, had babies, and continued to pursue her musical career. She took the role of a suffragette in the Guthrie Theatre production of *The Mother of Us All*, a groundbreaking opera with a libretto by Gertrude Stein and costumes designed by famed Pop Artist Robert Indiana.

Soon Paullette and Frank were off to Detroit where she again tried to establish herself as a classical singer. That goal, however, was stymied by the demands of being a full-time mom, as well as the family's itinerant "corporate gypsy" lifestyle, as they soon moved again.

Back to Minneapolis, which at the time was a center for independent and sponsored filmmaking, especially environmental documentaries. She was hired to write the theme music for several of them, which she also sang. Working for movie producers lead her to discover that writing film scripts seemed more fun than music theory, so she switched gears once again.

Finally, being free of the prosaic judgment of hidebound high school teachers, she took up writing with a vengeance. In Minneapolis, she partnered with a well-known filmmaker to create a documentary about Zona Gale who, in 1921, became the first woman to win a Pulitzer Prize. The movie collected many awards and accolades in the 1970s. It was screened internationally, as well as at New York City's prestigious Film Forum and the International Women's Film Festival.

The MacDougal's next stop on their journey was New Jersey again where in 1978 she wrote her first one-woman

play, *Ripenings*, based on the poet laureate of Minnesota,
Meridel LeSueur. This play toured the Midwest and the
Northeast, including a stint at Lincoln Center in New York.

Paullette continued to accrue credentials. In 1980, she completed an MFA degree in screenwriting at Columbia University, soon becoming an adjunct professor at Drew University. She also taught cinema studies at a local community school where one of her students had publishing connections. She was subsequently hired by an international publisher to write *Energistics*, a book on health and wellness, long before such works became ubiquitous.

Paullette and Frank moved to Singletree in 2000 and they continue to split their time between their Winslow Road house and Austin, TX. While they no longer ski, the house is by no means quiet in the winter. Their two sons, their wives, and their five grandchildren are often here enjoying our perfect winters, ripping up Vail and The Beave.


It was in Singletree that Paullette completed what may become her most produced work to date, a four-woman play entitled *Waiting for MacArthur*. This play has been seen in more than 25 theaters across the country, some repeated by "audience demand" in multiple seasons.


It's an international story of four women told in letters written by a young American nurse serving in embattled Corregidor during WWII to those back on the home front: her unhappy English teacher (a Canadian), her rigid German

American mother, and her best friend (who is secretly dating her boyfriend).

Because of continuous bombing, the tent hospital must move into a stifling tunnel. She doesn't want to upset her overly protective mother, so the nurse deliberately leaves out news about her own danger. She is only truthful about this to her former teacher, telling her of the horrors being experienced by the service men in the Philippines. The letters to her best friend and her mother tell a different tale - one of the heroism, dedication, and commitment of the American soldiers stationed there.

Paullette's next task is to find a publisher for her historical novel

telling the true story of Mary Richards. During the Civil War, Mary, while just a teenager, became the head dining room server in the home of Jefferson Davis, the President of the Confederacy. Pretending to be illiterate and despite the danger, Mary was able to collect and transmit valuable military secrets to the Union Army.

Paullette's fascination with women in wartime continues unabated. A composer in Texas has asked permission to create an opera about wartime Poland based on one of Paullette's WWII plays, Christmas in Krakow, 1944.

The composer would provide the score and Paullette, the libretto. She is considering it. "It might be an interesting project," she said. "The good people and the beauty of Singletree feed my creative spirit."

Paullette is truly one of Singletree's most accomplished and many-faceted residents. She loves sharing her story and I can assure you it is well worth a listen. It's difficult, if not impossible, to do her life justice given the spatial limitations of this magazine, so I strongly suggest you seek her out and get the full story directly from this true Renaissance woman.





Next up was a flight to Sicily! We landed in Palermo and drove to the hill town of Contessa Entellina where one of our producers makes some amazingly special Sicilian





THE TRIP OF MY LIFE


MaryLamb Lucas Shares Her Personal Memoir Written in Memory of Her Son, Trip Lucas

"I had two sets of younger twin sisters by the time I was three. I believe I had some abandonment issues from losing my mom's fulltime attention at two and then again at three. I resented that they followed me around like ducklings watching everything I did for a time. I even quit riding for a while because I didn't like them all sitting on the fence watching me get lessons in our pastures. They always destroyed my comic books. Did I mention that I have to keep working on forgiveness? I wish I could have a do-over. I could have been a much better brother. It was fun to be able to go drinking and climbing and skiing with them after college." - 25 Random Things About Me. #23 Trip Lucas, Facebook.

Following is a synopsis of the personal memoir, *The Trip of My Life*, written by MaryLamb Lucas, in which she shares her story of losing her son, Trip, to suicide and her journey to finding herself since his death.

It was early morning when my 48-year-old son, Trip, called to tell me that his girlfriend was breaking up with him and he didn't think that he could live through another breakup. White noise flooded my mind. My legs grew weak. He had considered suicide before when he and his wife





divorced. He told me that he had gotten a prescription for an anti-depressant and had taken one that morning. I'm a psychotherapist and knew that it would take about two weeks for it to take effect.

I was so paralyzed by fear that I was not able to ask some of the questions that I knew might help stop someone considering suicide. Trip complained about the phone connection that was acting very sketchy. I told him that AT&T was having problems, so I told Trip that I had an appointment at the dentist's and asked if I could call him











back when maybe the phone connection would be better. He said "yes." I said, "I love you." He replied "mmph."

When I got to the dentist's waiting room, I worried about Trip and knew he might well take his own life, but I was too panicked to think straight about how to stop him. He was in Austin, Texas and I was in Edwards, Colorado. How could I get to him quickly? The phone did not ring while I was at the dentist, but as soon as I got out, I had two messages, one from Trip's girlfriend Laura, and one from my daughter Kate. She was one of my older set of twin girls who were two years younger than Trip. She told me that Trip was thinking of shooting himself, that she had kept him talking, but when Laura called, he hung up to talk with her. Laura's message just said, "Call your son NOW."

I tried to reach Trip, Kate, and Laura with no luck because I still had no cell service. I drove until I found a place that had service and tried again. No luck. I waited and worried. My stomach was in knots. I called another daughter, Dana, one of the younger set of twin girls. She was close to Trip and is a nurse. She had heard what was happening but had not been able to talk with Trip. She decided to call hospitals in Austin, hoping Trip was wounded but alive. The day went on like that, waiting, no word, and agony.

I called a friend of mine in Austin who asked what he could do to help. I asked him to please go to Trip's and Laura's to see if he could find out something. He did. He called to tell me that Trip was gone that he had just been taken out in a body bag. I was a dish rag, my stomach dropped. Stunned, shocked,

guilty because I hadn't stopped him. Then angry that this happened. I wanted to cry but couldn't.

I called my sister, who called my other sister. We were talking when my ex-husband, Joe, called. He wanted to know what happened. He and his partner, Anne, wanted to know what, why, how, and more. I felt even angrier. Joe asked if Trip had any assets. What? I was in knots and wanted to hit him. Soon, friends and others asked some similar things that felt intrusive and not helpful or comforting for my grief.


I had never felt good about myself because of my parents' emotional abuse, and alcoholism, and now I felt worse. I began to write my memoir but after a couple of years into it, I missed Trip so much and wanted him to talk to me. I wanted to know what he thought about the book I was



writing that had been sparked by his death and had his name in it.

I contacted a medium nearby to have a session with Trip. It set me on the course of finding and becoming my true self. He does not blame me for his suicide, and he talked about how he wanted me to be "raw and vulnerable" which I assumed meant on the page. He also talked about how he knew how I had felt about myself, that I had strength and beauty and that he wanted me to believe that and to show it. I was touched by his words. He also told the medium that he was a catalyst for me to become me both through his life and death. His love for me felt real and comforting. He also told a funny story about me when he and the kids were growing up. I felt loved more than I ever had in my life until that moment.

Now it has been almost nine years with lots of grief, and lots of writing my story since Trip's death, and I can tell that I am stronger, that I now know that part of me and I am learning to love me. There's a quote by Marion Woodman, a Jungian analyst whom I once met and heard speak, and whose books I have read. It says, "There is no growth without real feeling. Children







not loved for who they are do not learn how to love themselves. Their growth is an exercise in pleasing others, not in expanding through experience. As adults, they must learn to nurture their own lost child." Because of Trip in my life, I am learning to nurture my lost child.

MaryLamb Lucas is a mostly retired psychotherapist in private practice who has lived in Singletree since 2007. A native West Virginian, she went to college in Virginia, married her husband, and raised their five children, prior to her attending graduate school. A writer from very early in life, her

writing has appeared at Aspen Summer Words in juried workshops. She is an avid skier and was a lifelong horsewoman until she traded her saddle for skis. She and her Standard Poodle/ Wheaton Terrier cross, Bijou, enjoy life in Singletree and the surrounding area with all its beauty and outdoor activities.

Singletree residents rally to raise awareness for suicide prevention by bringing a feature documentary to Eagle County

eptember is National Suicide Prevention Month. There is no doubt that our valley has seen more than its fair share of death by suicide. The news of losing a member of the Battle Mountain Class of '08 hit hard for Deb Robbins. "This tragedy was just more than I could bear. To learn it was a suicide made it that much harder," Deb shares in her grief. "Now both of my sons have lost a classmate by [their] own hand." She decided to do something about it.


Deb reached out to a close friend from high school who settled in Boulder. He and his amazing wife are philanthropists, writers, and film producers. Their most recent effort is the documentary, My Sister Liv. Deb is now working with the team at SpeakUp ReachOut to bring a screening of the documentary to Eagle County in November.

From Grammy Award winning Director Alan Hicks and Academy Award winning Producer Paula DuPré Pesmen, My Sister Liv is a feature documentary following the inseparable sisters Tess and Liv. Liv is a young girl growing up with the pressures of social media, depression, body dysmorphia, and, often, suicidal thoughts. The film takes us into the intimate journey of a young life on the edge, and ultimately a family finding healing through hope.

Erin Ivie, the Executive Director of SpeakUp ReachOut, explains that multiple community members reached out to SpeakUp ReachOut and Eagle Valley Behavioral Health requesting that the film be brought to our community to start the conversation about suicide with our youth, young adults, and their families. "We are excited to be able to respond to the request and support the screening of My Sister Liv," says Erin.

Singletree resident Celynn McClarrinon has joined the committee of volunteers working with SpeakUp Reach Out. When asked why, Celynn explains, "As a grief counselor, I know it is important to listen to a griever. I am hoping by being involved I can be someone to help listen to the community, the parents, and our kids as we continue to support each other through all levels of our emotions." Celynn goes on to say, "As a mother, I want to be involved to help keep our kids talking and sharing their thoughts and feelings."

Deb enthusiastically encourages the community to participate in the effort to raise awareness for My Sister Liv. "I love that Erin calls our committee the Hype Squad! We are indeed a group of people motivated to make a difference." She adds a personal plea, "Please help us get the word out so that we can fill the venues with students and parents alike in an effort to turn the tide here in Eagle County."




